

## Eugene ends parking incentive plan

Parking control officers have been giving out brochures and bus passes to individuals receiving citations in Eugene's free-parking zone.

On April 8, officers began placing brochures, bus passes

and citations on vehicles parked for long periods of time between 4th and 14th avenues and Lincoln and Pearl streets.

The brochure includes information about carpooling, car-pool matching for drivers living in the same area, ridesharing, Lane Transit District, bicycling and employee parking permits. Today is the last day the brochures will be issued and are

only available by receiving a parking citation.

The plan is aimed at people who are employed in the downtown area and park their vehicles without permits. The city hopes to increase public awareness to transportation options through the plan.

The project is funded by a grant from the Oregon Department of Energy.

## Cultural forum seeks applicants

Applications for three student positions on the EMU Cultural Forum will be open until Wednesday at 5 p.m.

Frank Geltner, University program consultant for the cul-

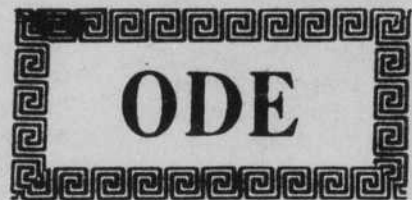
tural forum, says he must fill the visual arts, performing arts and folk concerts positions.

The student in charge of visual arts will be responsible for coordinating gallery exhibits, an undergraduate art show and speakers on the arts. The performing arts representative sets up theater and dance appearances, and the folk concerts representative coordinates the Willamette Valley Bluegrass Festival, among other events, according to Geltner.

Each position requires five to 10 volunteer hours per week, but Geltner says they provide students who are interested in the arts with valuable contacts in their fields.

He says academic credit can occasionally be arranged with "a sympathetic faculty member."

Four other positions on the Cultural Forum board have already been filled.

## Committee to review parking study

The Diethelm-Bressler report on the feasibility of parking in the Silva Orchard area will be discussed by the Campus Planning Committee in an open meeting on May 7 at 7:30 p.m. in the EMU, room to be posted.

The report was reviewed by the transportation subcommittee of the planning committee on April 8 and 15. That committee's recommendations will also be discussed by the planning committee.

"It has always been our understanding that no decision related to the future of the Silva property would be made until the campus community had had an opportunity in full on the issues it (the report) raises," says David Rowe, University planner.

"We would hope that anyone interested in the issues involving the Silva property would present (at the open meeting) either verbal or written statements," he says.
