

Dormitory director stresses learning

Dormitory living is regaining popularity among university students nationwide, in part due to increased interest in group living, says Daniel Williams, the new director of housing at the University.

High on Williams' list of priorities for the coming year are new programs for the University living units that will enhance the group living experience.

Williams says he will encourage faculty to join students for meals at the dorms and to offer symposia and discussions. He also would like to see more cultural activities, more guests-in-residence and the resident assistants offering seminars. Distinguished visitors to campus will be encouraged to participate in coffee hours at the dorms.

The new director, who came

to the University from Stanford on April 1, is a native of Astoria, Ore. During his 13 years at Stanford, he spent two years as associate dean of students for residential education, developing dormitory educational programming for 6,000 students.

Most recently he was associate dean of the students for campus affairs and director of Stanford's student union.

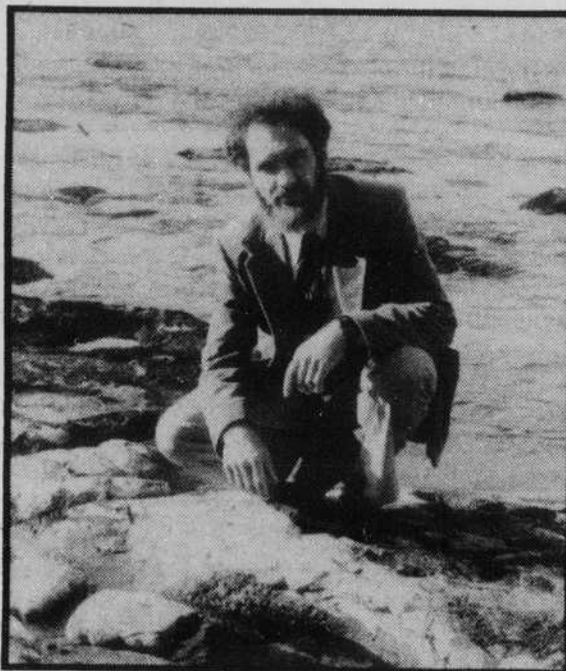

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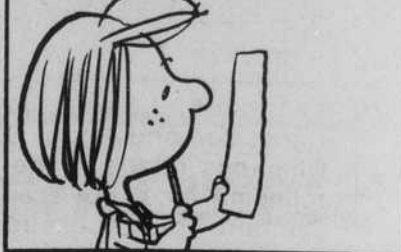
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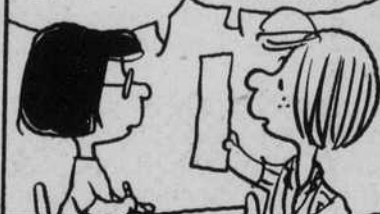
