

Applications open for Fulbright grants

University students are competing successfully for Fulbright-Hays awards for graduate study abroad, according to Kenneth Ghent, acting director of international student services.

Seven University students are studying abroad this year on the grants, and another eight are finalists for awards for 1980-81, he said.

Ghent said competition for

1981-82 is now open. About 519 grants for study in 50 countries are expected to be available. Funding comes from the Fulbright-Hays Act of 1961 as well as from foreign countries, corporations, universities and private donors.

Deadline for applications is expected to be Oct. 17. "Because this date comes early in the fall term, it is desirable that interested students begin

the application process in the spring," Ghent says.

The purpose of the grants is to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and other countries through the exchange of a person's knowledge and skills.

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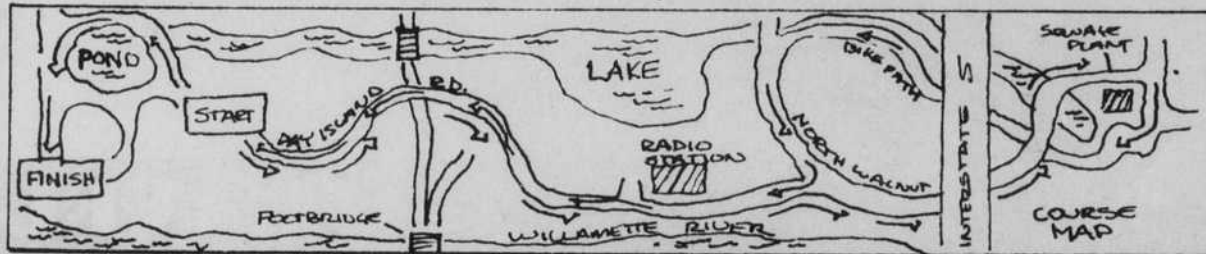

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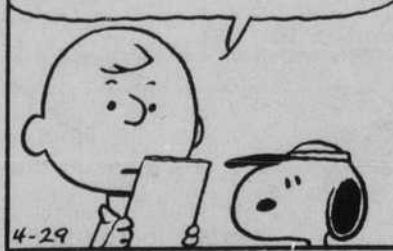
