

Publisher to give Ruhl lecture

Reg Murphy, publisher and editor of The San Francisco Examiner since 1975, will deliver the Ruhl Lecture for the University School of Journalism's fifth annual Ruhl Symposium.

Murphy will speak at 7:30 p.m. May 12 in the Dad's Rom of the Erb Memorial Union. His topic is "Those Impertinent Editors: Do They Set the National Agenda?"

The public is welcome to attend without charge.

Murphy, who attended Mercer University and began his newspaper career in Macon, Ga., was the political editor and then editor of the Atlanta Constitution during the 1960s and early 1970s. He co-authored a book, "The Southern Strategy," and has lectured on more than 200 college campuses. He was

Nieman Fellow at Harvard University.

Although Murphy's criticisms of Pres. Jimmy Carter have been widely quoted and distributed, Murphy is probably best known for the time when he was kidnapped in 1974. He was held captive for 50 hours until a \$700,000 ransom was paid by The Atlanta Constitution for his release.
