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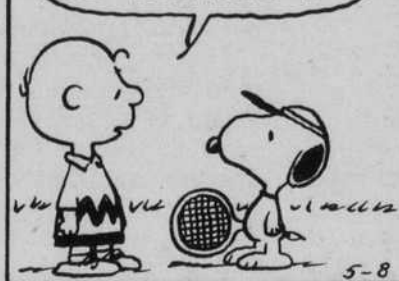
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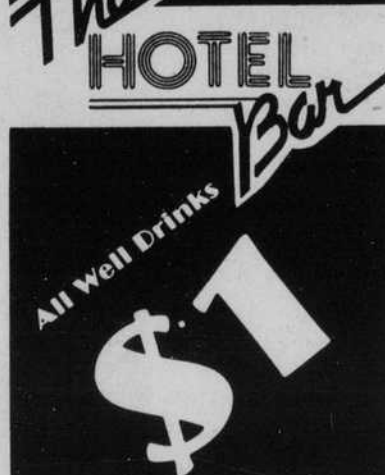

Each year, as the political races start, there are some candidates and campaign workers who violate the City's Sign Code simply because they are not aware of the Sign Code regulations. Political signs are not permitted on public property, such as utility poles on public right-of-way and parking strips (i.e., that area between the street curb and the public sidewalk).

Political signs must be limited to 32 square feet (for example, the size of a 4' x 8' sheet of plywood). Such signs may be wall-mounted or pole-mounted with a maximum height of eight feet above grade. Political signs may not be illuminated (lighted). All political signs must be removed two weeks after the day of election.
