

Cuban writer to lecture

An internationally acclaimed Cuban novelist and essayist, Emundo Desnoes, will speak on "Writing Under Capitalism, Writing Under Socialism" at 7:30 p.m. Thursday at the University.

The free lecture will be held in Allen Hall, Room 221.

Born in Havana, Cuba, in 1930, Desnoes is presently adviser to the Cuban Ministry of Culture. He has been editor of the literary supplement to the official Cuban newspaper "Revolucion," was editor of "Arts and Literature" magazine and was a member of the editorial board of "Casa de las Americas" magazine.

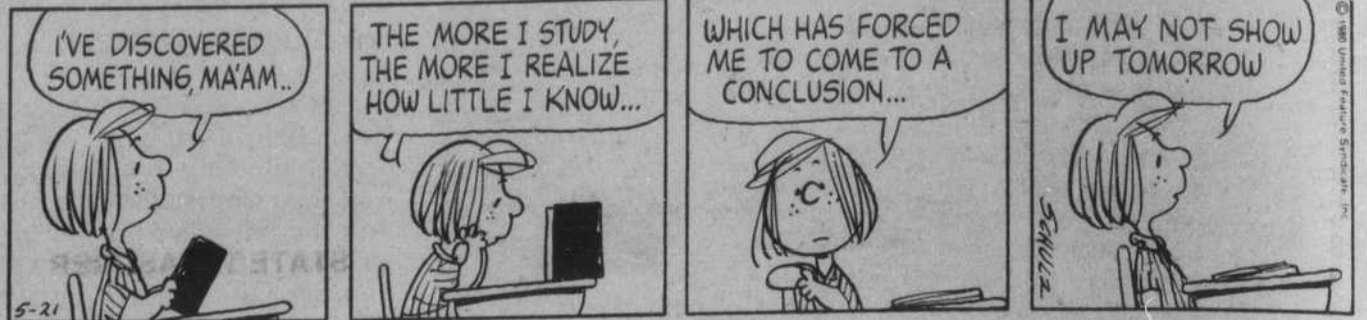
His works include two collections of essays and three novels. He also wrote the screenplay "Memories of Underdevelopment," based on one of the novels.

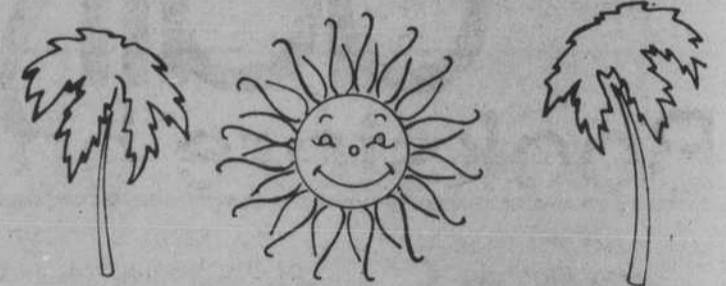
