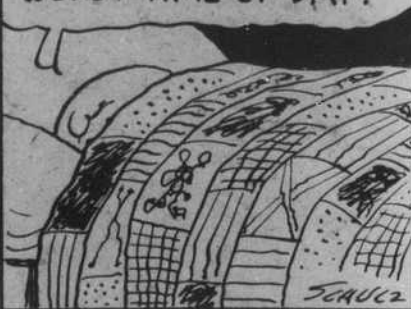

All items must be turned in by noon the day before publication at the Emerald Office, Room 300, EMU.



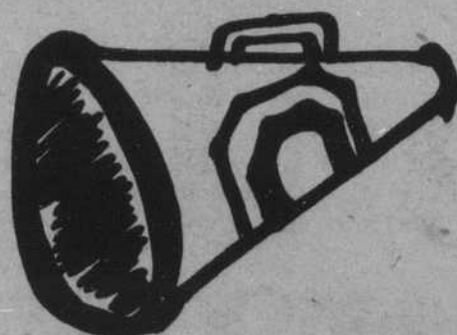
