

Professor to head German center

Edward Diller, a University professor of German, has been appointed resident director of the Oregon Study Center in Germany for the 1980-81 academic year.

The center was established in 1968 at Stuttgart through the combined efforts of Oregon State University and the Uni-

versity of Oregon.

Diller replaces Fritz Kramer, a Portland State University professor, as director of the study center.

Diller has been a University faculty member since 1965, and has been the recipient of a Fulbright grant to Germany twice. He has also served as director

of the Robert Clark Honors College from 1972 to 1977, and was president of the American Association of Teachers of German from 1978 to 1979.

He received his bachelor's degree from UCLA, his master's degree from Los Angeles State University, and his doctorate from Middlebury, VT, College.
