

Littman receives first Johnson award

A University psychology professor long active in campus governance and well known for his teaching and research about behavior has been chosen the first recipient of the Charles E. Johnson Memorial Award.

Richard Littman, who currently chairs the University Senate, will receive the honor June 8 during the University's 103rd spring commencement.

The award, established by the University Assembly last year in

memory of Johnson who served as acting president in the late 1960s, honors a faculty member who "by action and word as teacher, as scholar and as citizen of the academic community has, over a period of years, exemplified commitment to the ... principles affirmed by the life and career of Charles E. Johnson."

Littman, a member of the University faculty since 1948, is a graduate of George Washing-

ton University, Washington, D.C., and Ohio State University, Columbus. He headed the University psychology department for five years in the mid-1960s and in 1971-73, served the University as vice provost for academic planning and resources.

The Johnson award recipient was selected by the award committee from a field of nominees submitted by members of the campus community.
