

Olympic documentaries span 50 years of sports

An Olympic Games film festival begins at 9 a.m. today at the McDonald Theater on the Eugene Downtown Mall.

Five documentary films of the past half-century of Olympic games will be shown in chronological order, beginning with Leni Riefenstahl's "Olympia, Part I," which documents the 1936 Berlin games. At 10:45 a.m. Kon Ichikawa's "Tokyo Olympiad" shows the 1964 games, followed by "The Olympics in Mexico" (1968) at 1 p.m., "1972 Olympics — Munich" at 3 p.m. and "The Games of the XXI Olympiad" (1976) at 5 p.m. There will be a break between 12:15-1 p.m. for lunch; the festival will end around 6:45 p.m.

Series tickets for the festival are \$6, available at the EMU Main Desk, Meier and Frank ticket office at Valley River Center; Nike-Eugene in the Atrium on the Downtown Mall and Feets at 1290 Oak St. Tickets for individual films are \$2.50 each at the theater.

A rally to oppose the draft and the Olympic Boycott will be held Saturday at 3 p.m. on the East Lawn of the EMU. For more information call 345-1873.

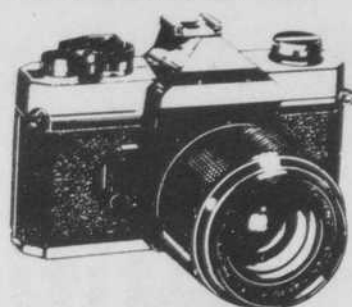
