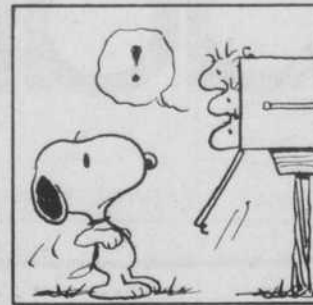
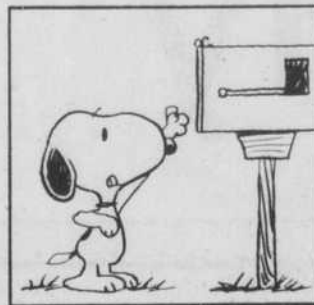

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New phone services available

Hearing- and speech-impaired telephone users in Oregon can now place operator-assisted calls and request directory assistance information from a special operator center.

The special center, which opened Monday in Oakland, Cal., allows users of Telecommunication Devices for the Deaf — keyboard devices that transmit and receive typed messages through the phone network — to place collect, credit-card, person-to-person and third-number calls.

In addition to directory assistance, TDD users can now directly obtain credit for misdialed calls, receive aid in placing and completing calls or get referrals to repair service.

By dialing a toll-free number, 1-800-8755-1155, TDD users in Oregon and 12 other Western states will contact one of 21 Pacific Telephone operators.

Operators will respond the same way as with other cus-

tomers, but their answers will appear as a video display printout on the TDD user's terminal.

A customer instruction booklet is available to all TDD users through local PNB Phone Center Stores; copies have been mailed to all known TDD users. The toll-free operator service number will be listed on

the Call Guide pages of all new Pacific Northwest Bell directories.

Information about any of the products and services available through PNB's special services is available at the Eugene Phone Center Store, 484-7700, or TDD users can call Portland, toll-free, at 1-227-8973.
