Workshops study energy conservation

The Bethel Energy Efficiency Program and Eugene Parks and Recreation are sponsoring a summer energy workshop series, tonight through July 26.

Tonight from 7-9, Bill Welch of the Willamette Valley Solar Energy Association leads "Solar Basics," an introduction to the basics of solar energy. Fee for the workshop is \$1.

Saturday's workshop is "Solar Fun for Kids," at 10 a.m. Children will construct and take home a solar oven-food dryer. Preregistration and a \$1 fee are required.

July 15, Dale Armitage, a Lane County energy extension agent, demonstrates home weatherization, do-it-yourself style. This workshop is free.

July 22, a van tour of energy-efficient sites in the Bethel neighborhood is scheduled from 7-9 p.m. Preregistration and a \$1 fee are required.

July 26 at 10 a.m., participants can help construct a solar collector. The Willamette Valley Solar Energy Association co-sponsors this workshop; preregistration and a \$2 fee are required.
