

University proposes rule amendments

The University has proposed amendments to three permanent rules dealing with disposal of student records, eviction from student housing and fundraising.

The amendments will go into effect after filing with the Office of the Secretary of State following the close of the public comment period Wednesday.

The amendment to the

student records rule extends to three years the time application materials must be kept on file for students not admitted or admitted but not enrolled in graduate programs and those undergra-

duate programs that limit enrollment. The amendment also clarifies the length of time student disciplinary records are to be maintained.

The amendment to the eviction rule provides procedures for filing notice of eviction and holding a formal hearing if a student does not agree with the propriety of the eviction.

The third amendment brings the University's fund-raising rule into congruence with its recently updated rule on commercial sales on the campus. The amendment makes it clear that references to sale of goods and services in the fund-raising rule is not intended to include commercial solicitation or commercial sales.

Copies of the three amendments proposed are available at a number of campus locations including the Office of the President, 110 Johnson Hall and the ASUO president's office in Suite 4 EMU. Individuals wishing to present views or request a hearing may do so in writing to Muriel K. Jackson, Assistant for Administration, Office of the President, 110 Johnson Hall, before 5 p.m. Wednesday.

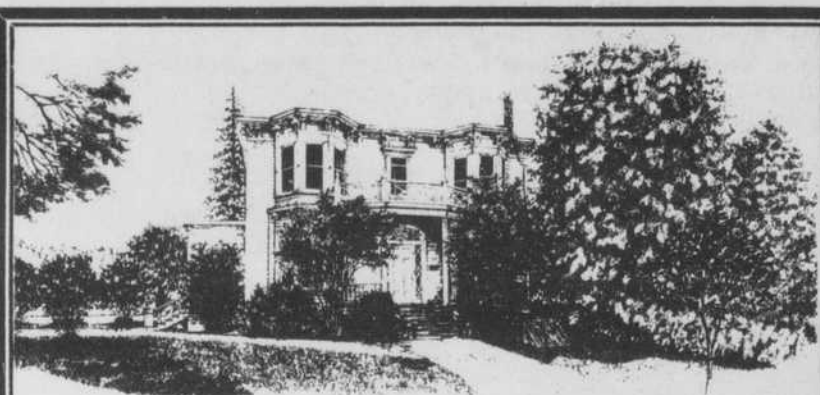
KGAL plans float down Willamette

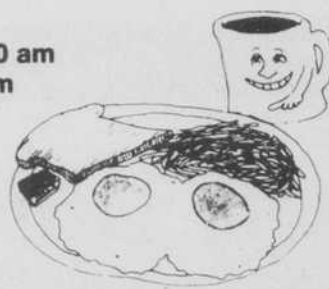
