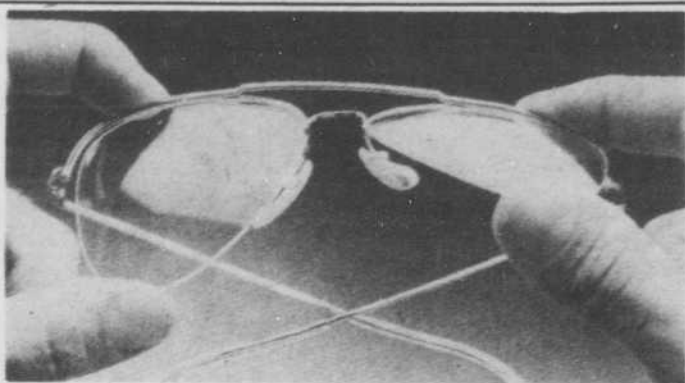




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SUAB booth gives students direction

Lost? Have a gripe?

The SUAB Information and Grievance booth, located in the main lobby of the EMU, offers students information on programs, activities on campus, services on campus, and overall general student information, according to Lisa Bauman of the SUAB.

The booth is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The position of booth director is currently open to work-study students. The position will be open for two weeks, according to affirmative action guidelines, Bauman says.

Once a director has been chosen, he or she will decide on staffing for the booth. In the past, the booth has been staffed with volunteers and faculty, Bauman says. "Each of the 17 SUAB members spend one hour per week in the booth," she says.

The most commonly asked questions are for directions or grievances, in which case staffers help the students fill out forms. These forms are then passed on to the appropriate representative on SUAB, who will deal with the grievance by going to the department involved or to student advocacy, Bauman says.

CSPA slates mediation conference

A two-day series of workshops and panel discussions on environmental mediation will be held Oct. 10-11 at the Black Angus restaurant, 2123 Franklin Blvd.

Sponsored by the University's Wallace School of Community Service and Public Affairs as its annual assembly for CSPA alumni and others, the conference is open to the public. Registration is scheduled for between 11 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Friday.

Gerald Cormick, director of the University of Washington environmental mediation office, will lead a workshop at 1 p.m., which will explore mediation as an alternative to litigation in solving environmental disputes and controversies.

Friday evening at 7:30 p.m., Rick Gustafson, executive officer of the Portland Metropoli-

tan Service District, will discuss the district's progress since last year, when it became the nation's first regional government controlled by a directly-elected council.

University provost Richard Hill, acting vice president for academic affairs and former CSPA dean, will address the concluding session at noon Saturday.
