Group gives bucks for books

The University School of Law has received \$5,000 from the Oregon Law Institute to help purchase additional books for its library.

The grant is one of three, each for \$5,000, which the institute recently awarded to law libraries at Lewis and Clark College, Portland, and at Willamette University, Salem.

Eugene attorney Malcolm Scott, president of the insti-

tute's 14-member board of directors, said the gifts represent "tangible support and appropriate reinvestment in the source of legal education, the libraries of the state's law schools."

The institute is a one-year-old, non-profit corporation with offices at the University School of Law. It offers continuing legal education through courses, workshops and publication to the state's attorneys.

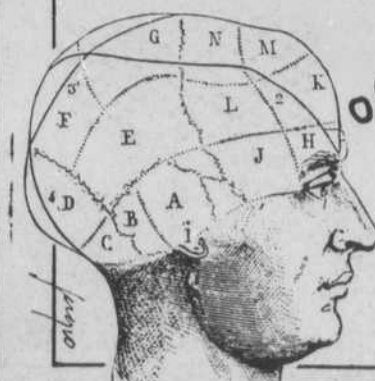
