Rule amendments take effect

The University has proposed amendments to two permanent rules, one dealing with student fund-raising activities and the other with Amazon Family Housing governance.

The amendments will go into effect after filing with the Office of the Secretary of State following the close of public comment Jan. 30.

The amendments to the rules on fund raising by student groups in University-owned facilities clarify or improve fiscal

accounting procedures. The changes spell out where the funds are to be deposited. Registered student organizations will deposit raised funds in a trust fund account in the EMU, while University departments, residence halls and University-affiliated organizations will deposit funds in the appropriate departmental, EMU or trust fund account.

The amendments also clarify the uses of such funds, noting that the money must be used for the benefit of the organization

"in line with its statement of purpose filed at the time of registration or recognition as a student organization or as thereafter updated."

The amendments to the permanent rule concerning the Amazon Housing Policy Board and Amazon Tenants Council Organization are language changes to make the rule similar to the one for the Westmoreland Family Housing Policy Board and Tenants Council. The amendments were requested by Amazon tenants.

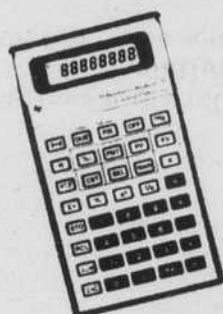

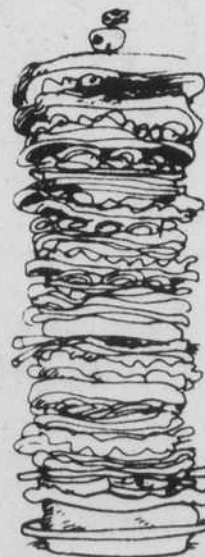
