A Seattle architectural firm, the Callison partnership, recently gave the University architecture department a \$250 grant in recognition of the excellent contributions made to the firm by recent University graduates.

The grant was originally earmarked for the new School of Architecture and Allied Arts' building. Because of budget

cuts, construction is likely to be postponed.

"We're corresponding with the firm to decide on the use of the grant" says architecture department head Jerry Finrow.

The department will suggest that the grant be used in alumni relations, to bring a notable speaker to campus or for academic scholarships.

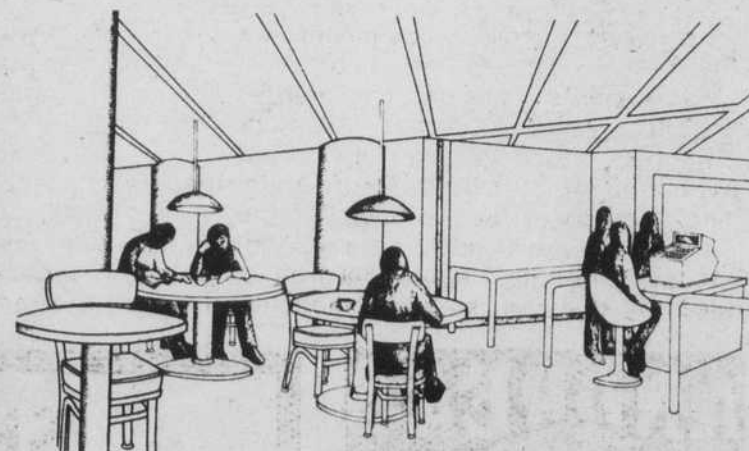
