

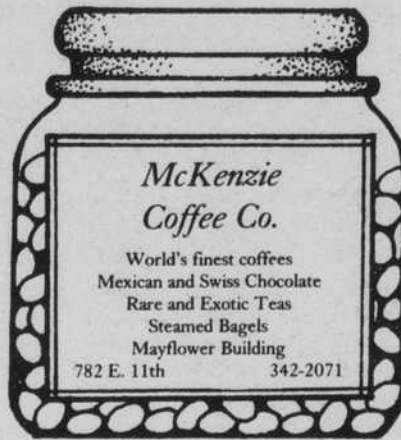
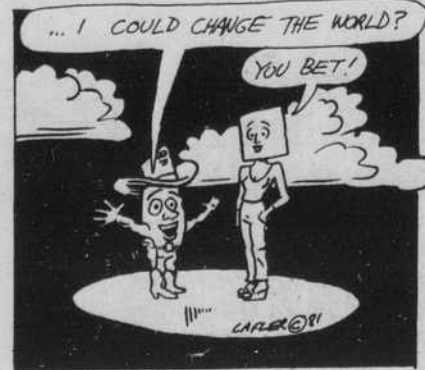

Museum shows artifacts

Artifacts from the oldest known systematically excavated prehistoric site in the Willamette Valley, including tools dated up to 4,000 years old, are now on display in the University Museum of Natural History.

The exhibit is based on the 1976 excavations of two prehistoric sites near Salem conducted by a museum team led by University survey archaeologist

for highways Richard Pettigrew.

In 1976, the widening of the North Santiam Highway near Salem made necessary the excavation of the sites. Archaeological sites are legally protected and must be excavated if they cannot be avoided during construction projects.

The museum is open from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
