

Thwarting 'plans' for WW III

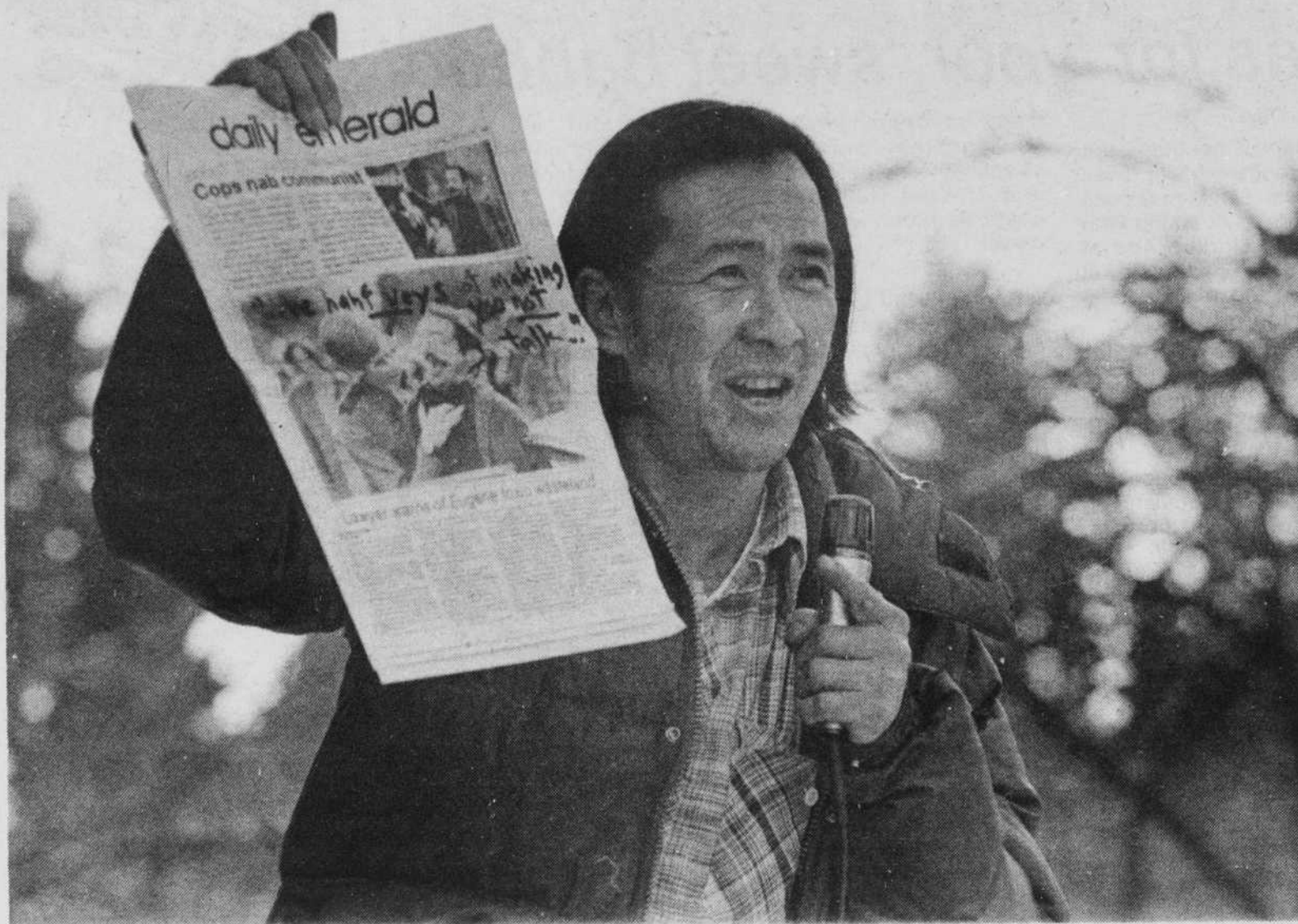

Burning a yellow ribbon during ex-hostage Victor Tomseth's University visit was a "righteous act," several Revolutionary Communist Youth Brigade members said at a rally on the EMU Terrace Thursday afternoon.

The yellow ribbons frequently displayed during the hostage crisis symbolize "World War III planning," Ismet Guchan told about 300 people.

"What we were burning down were the war preparations," Guchan said, referring to Monday's incident where RCYB-member John Kaiser ran before the EMU Ballroom stage with a burning yellow cloth as Tomseth entered the room.

Kaiser, who was arraigned Tuesday on charges of first-degree arson stemming from the incident, told reporters the severity of the charge was a political statement by the Eugene police.

Guchan was arrested on the terrace Wednesday and charged with hindering prosecution during Monday's incident. Another RCYB member who spoke at the rally, Nancy Whitley, also was charged with arson. All three were released earlier this week on bail.

in the University's music school have master's — and about 65 percent have doctorates.

At the undergraduate level, enrollment is down slightly after a "rapid increase" until 1979. Graduate enrollment, however, has maintained a steady increase.

The University graduates two times as many music majors as the other five Oregon music schools combined — or about two-thirds of the majors in the state.

Rider attributes part of the undergraduate enrollment drop

to students' changing career views.

"Public school teaching is not all that attractive to students," he says. Students, instead, major in high-salary jobs like computer science.

But Rider says he's "very optimistic" about career opportunities in public schools.

"If a student goes into teaching it can lead to administrative jobs."

And, he says, public school teachers often move on to higher education jobs.

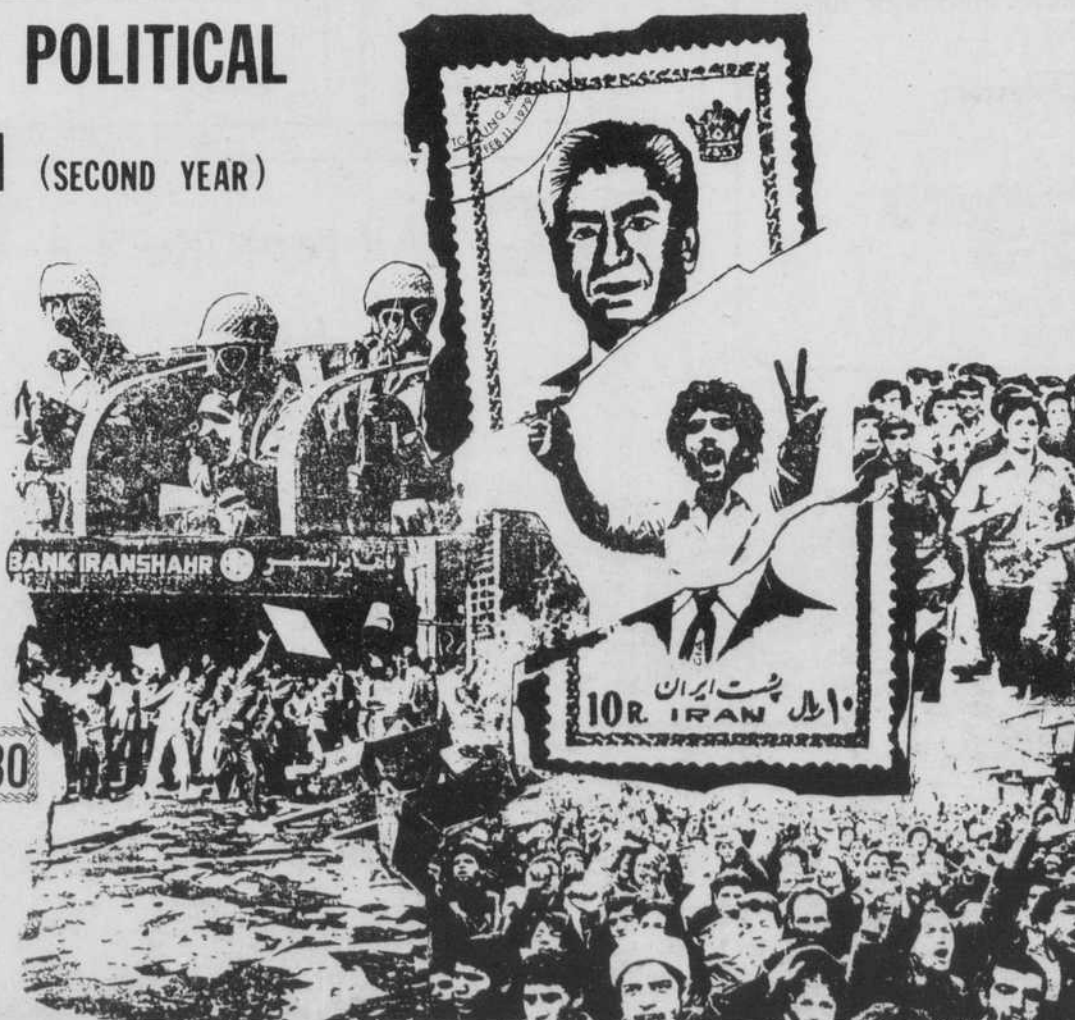
