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UOHSC earns accredited status

The University of Oregon Health Sciences Center in Portland, independent of the University since 1975, has earned accreditation as a free-standing university.

Before 1975, the schools of dentistry, medicine and nursing were part of the University and were accredited through the

University. When the three schools formed the UOHSC — now 2,054 students strong — in 1975, the institution began seeking accreditation as an independent university.

The Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges and the National League for Nursing visited the institution last year to

evaluate its programs. The school's nursing programs were re-accredited through the NLN and the Oregon State Board of Nursing. The medical and dentistry schools had received prior approval.

In announcing the accreditation, UOHSC Pres. Leonard Laster said the process had "proceeded without problems" despite the "many diverse and long-standing deficiencies (noted by the accreditors) in the resources of this institution."

The accreditation team reported deficiencies in the school's finances, faculty-student ratio and classroom and library space.

The evaluation team also urged Laster to change the

school's name to eliminate confusion between the UOHSC and the University.

Scavengers find \$14,000

WILSONVILLE (AP) — Three Portland men wanted cash for the cans they collected, but they didn't expect \$14,000.

The men, who asked not to be identified, found the cash Friday while they were looking for deposit bottles and cans along Interstate 5 south of Wilsonville.

The University Survival Center is sponsoring a series of speeches, slide shows and discussions this week highlighting important issues of the ocean environment.

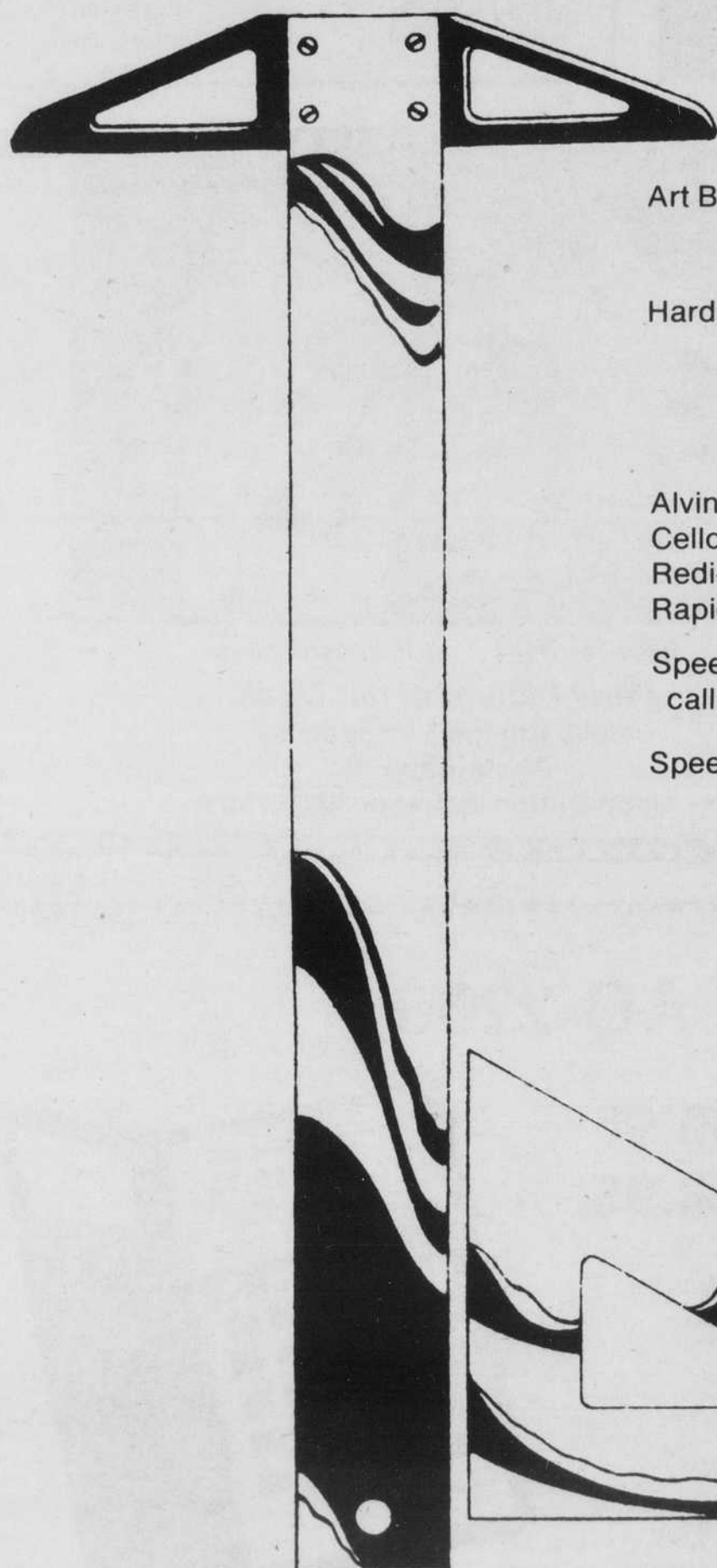
Today through Thursday, the Ocean Symposium will include presentations by Greenpeace about marine mammals, a demonstration on cooking with
