Dance

Friday and Saturday nights mark the close of the "Yeats and The Dance" production at Maude Kerns Art Center.

Selected poems and a short play by William Butler Yeats will be presented under the direction of Michael Wilson with

choreography by the Mary Miller Dance Company. Dancers from the company, readers and a harpist work together, individually and in combinations to create the program.

Director Michael Wilson describes this performance as an experiment with a variety of art forms. In 1979 Wilson directed the production of *him* by e.e. cummings and Mary Miller choreographed a section of the play and danced in it with another dancer from the company. Miller and Wilson discovered an artistic compatability at that time which they have continued to explore.

Full Moon in March is the chosen work (and also Yeats' personal favorite). The play and poems examine what it is like to be young, to be growing older and to accept old age.

Dancers include Miller, Robin

Collen, Theresa Sakrison, Marta Dost and Martha Lee. The adult reader is Jody McCoy. Student readers (from Condon Elementary School) are Katy Pease and Matthew Bloch. Laura Zaerr accompanies the readers and dancers on harp.

Admission is \$3.50 for advance reservations (call 689-5864). Reservations will be held until 7:50 p.m. Admission at the door is \$4. Reservations are recommended.

On campus, student choreographers and performers present their winter dance concert Friday and Saturday at Dougherty Dance Theatre, Gerlinger Annex.

"Winter Works," a program including a variety of dance styles from abstract-modern to jazz to contemporary ballet, will be performed at 8:30 p.m. both days. Admission is \$2. Tickets available at the door.

Dance students participating in the winter concert are Marta Dost, Tamara Lorr and Catherin Guerin.

Proceeds go to the university Student Dance Board, and will be used to bring guest artists and dance companies to the campus. For additional information call 686-3386.

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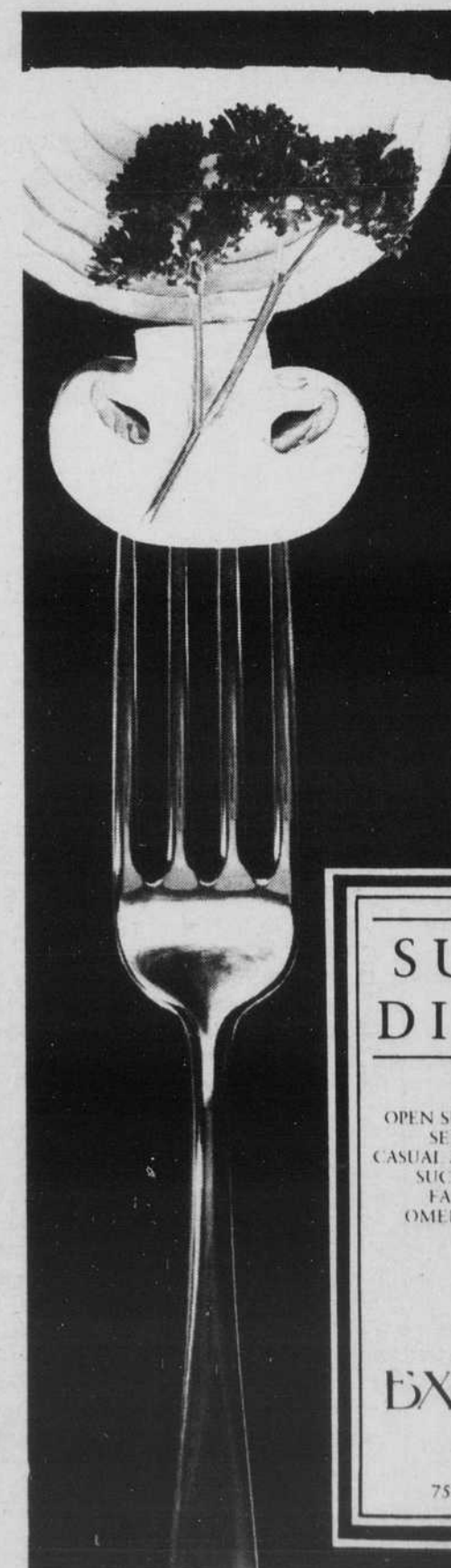
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
