University adds \$141 million to area

Visitors at University events and programs spent \$13 million in the Eugene area last, according to an economic impact report prepared by the University Office of Business Affairs.

Events that drew visitors ranged from alumni reunions and parents' weekend activities to special conferences and

workshops, concerts, plays museum shows and sports events.

Total spending by tourists in Eugene-Springfield is about \$113 million.

The overall impact of the University on the Eugene area economy was \$141.75 million in 1979-80, according to University director of business affairs W. N. McLaughlin. This figure is a 7

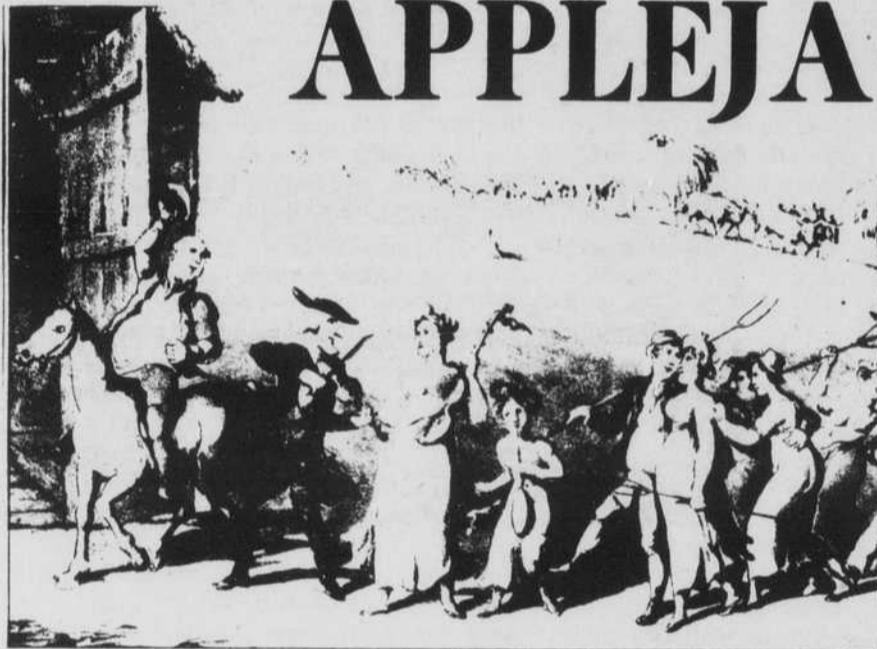
percent increase over last year.

The University's estimated operational expenditures of \$85.5 million, plus student expenditures of \$42 million and visitor expenditures of \$13 million add up to \$140.5 million, McLaughlin says. In addition, the area received approximately \$1.25 million in state gas, cigarette, liquor and revenue sharing funds because the University is here.
