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Matmen choke at NCAA; Kelly finishes in fourth place

Ryan Kelly's fourth-place performance highlighted the Oregon wrestling team's trip to nationals in an otherwise lackluster effort by the Ducks.

Oregon finished with 15 team points, which placed them around 20th in the tournament.

Iowa shattered the tournament record, amassing 129½ points to easily outdistance all opponents.

Oregon, the Pacific-10 Conference champions, finished behind both Oregon State (10th) and Arizona State (11th). Kelly, 167, assured of an All-American ranking by reaching the semifinals, lost to Tony Mantella of Temple University, 5-2, in the semifinal match.

He then returned in the consolation semifinals to beat John Forshee of Iowa State, the number one seed entering the tournament, 5-2.

But Kelly fell in the consolation finals to Gino Savegnaga of Eastern Illinois, 8-2, to finish fourth.

"I'm really pleased with Ryan, both with his performance in the tournament and for the job he has done all year long," said coach Ron Finley. "His improvement over the season,

over the last year, has been tremendous."

The rest of the Ducks didn't fare as well. Rick O'Shea and Cliff Porter were the only other Ducks to make it to Friday's competition, but they didn't last long.

O'Shea lost to Jim Reily of Penn State, 4-1, and Porter fell to Mark Bower of Augustana, 8-5. Neither wrestler earned a place.

Two other Oregon wrestlers — Bill Nugent and Jeff Steubing — were eliminated Friday when the wrestler who beat them lost in the next round, thus severing their chance of continuing in the tournament.

Forbes breaks school record in 10,000 run

Sophomore Eryn Forbes set an Oregon record in the 10,000-meter run Saturday in a pre-season race at Oregon State's Wayne Valley Field.

Forbes' 34:23.8 beat the 34:28.5 mark set by Molly Morton in 1979.

Oregon's Mimi Carlo and Alice Munz finished second and third, respectively.

In a heptathlon competition held in conjunction with the 10,000 race, Oregon's Jeanne Borchardt finished eighth with 4,480 points.

In other women's track competition this weekend, Oregon's Lexie Miller advanced to the 60-meter hurdles semifinals of the AIAW indoor championships, finishing fourth in her heat in 8.53. Only the top three in the semis advanced to the finals.

Tennis squad sponsors meet

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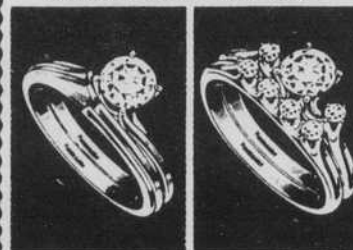
