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Exxon grant fuels global issues study

The International Studies Program has received a \$104,000 grant from the Exxon Education Foundation for a study on global perspectives and issues.

The funds will support the development of three courses on the subdivisions of global studies: population and resources, developed and developing nations and world

civilizations.

Program director Clarence Thurber defined global studies as the "systematic inquiry into the series of overlapping systems that characterize the world of this and coming decades," including world political, economic and social systems.

The program solicited the private support to serve the program's rapidly growing enrollment. "The unexpectedly

widespread student demand for the new major has created an urgent need for further course development," Thurber says.

Currently there are 40 majors in the program. Enrollment is expected to exceed 100 in the next several years.

The grant also will be used by the College of Arts and Sciences and College of Education, Thurber said.

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LTD offers free rides

Lane Transit District patrons will be able to ride the bus for free Saturday as part of a transit day promoting alternative transportation available in the Eugene/Springfield area.

In addition to offering free rides, LTD will hold a community transit fair at Lane County Fairgrounds Auditorium from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The fair will showcase possible route changes being considered by the district to help cut operating costs and improve service.

The changes would take existing "loop" routes — those which loop through different neighborhoods — and convert them to "line" routes where

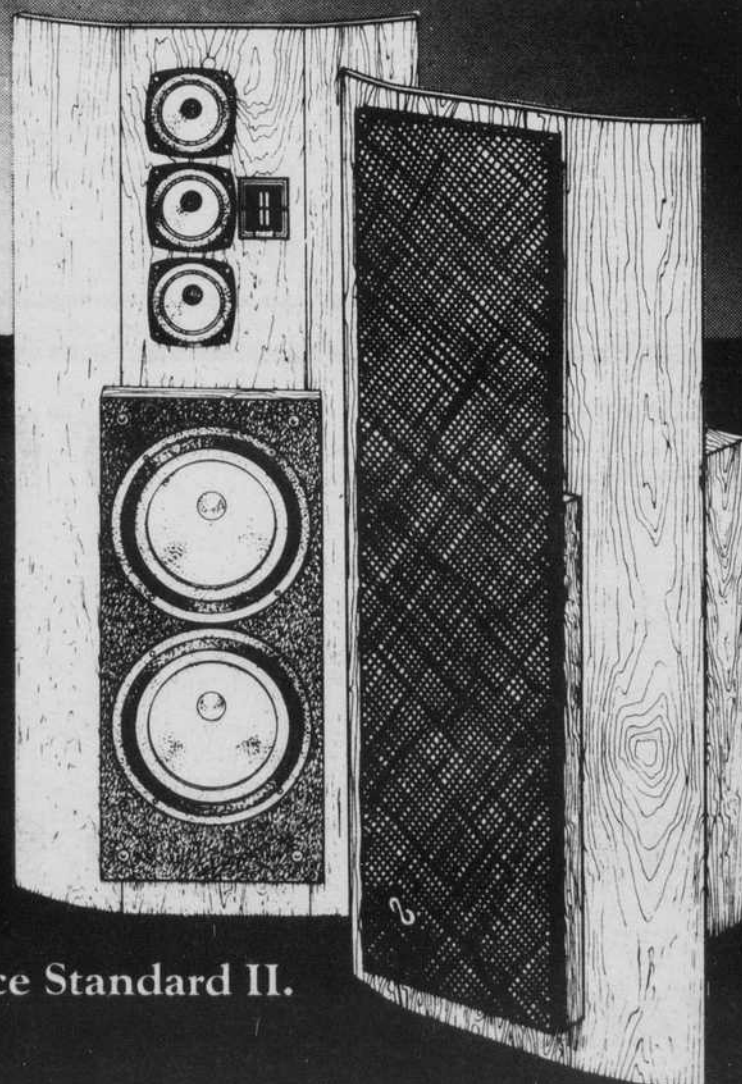
buses would double back on the same streets. Officials have said the line routes would be cheaper to operate and easier to adjust to varying ridership demand.

The fair also will feature LTD's new buses equipped with wheelchair lifts for the handicapped.

To further help the handicapped, the district has purchased a TTY machine to provide hearing impaired people with scheduling information. The machine — similar to a video display terminal — allows hearing impaired persons with access to another TTY to call the district about bus schedules.

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
