## Getting rid of homophobic myths

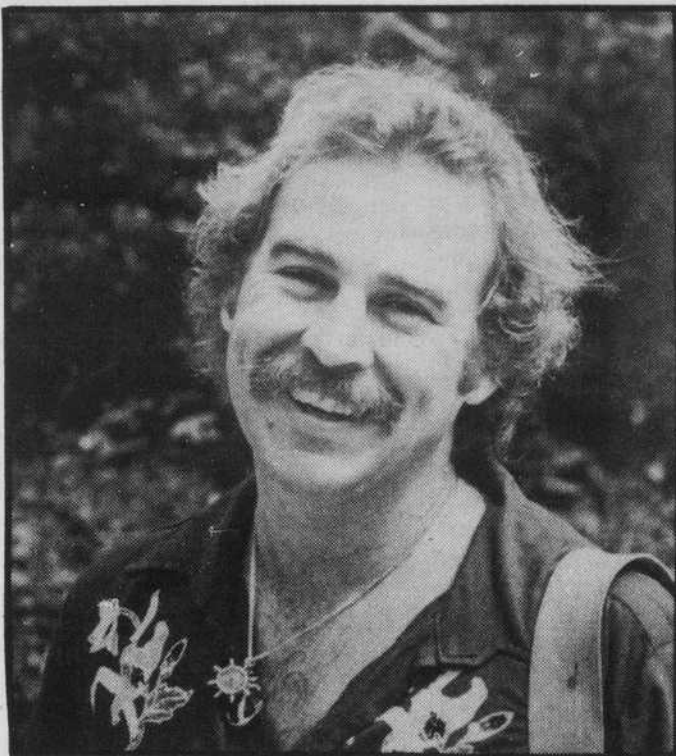
