

Two days of speakers, workshops, tests

Broad spectrum of health topics takes stage

Physical and mental well being is the focus of the sixth annual Health Fair, scheduled for April 15 and 16 at the University.

More than 40 health organizations, holistic practitioners and public health agencies are expected to participate in the free event, which will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom.

The fair is sponsored by the Oregon Students' Association for the Advancement of Health

Education and the University health education department.

"The purpose of the fair is to promote good health and wellness," says Aggie Picard, publicity coordinator for the event and a health education senior. "Also, the event aims to inform people about the wide variety of health services available in our community."

According to Picard, exhibitors will present the latest information on issues such as nutrition, birth control and holistic

health care.

In addition, the Student Health Center will provide a free series of examinations including vision screening, blood pressure, lung capacity and tuberculin skin tests.

New this year are 10 two-hour workshops on such topics as guidelines for optimal well being, tofu and tempeh preparation, prevention of running injuries, nutrition, the urban use of pesticides, natural family planning, the hospice

movement and how emotions affect health.

Room numbers for the workshop will be posted near the EMU Main Desk.

Wednesday's events include a natural foods buffet in the ballroom from 11:30 a.m. to 1

p.m. Tickets are \$3 each and available at the main desk or by calling the health education department at 686-4119. The menu will include vegetarian lasagna, vegetable pot pie, a deluxe salad bar, herb tea and fresh fruit juices.
