Philip Klutznick, former commerce secretary and a prominent Chicago attorney and businessman, will speak on the current state of the American economy today at 3:30 p.m. in the Gerlinger Alumni Lounge.

He also will speak on problems and prospects in international trade Wednesday at 3:30 p.m. in the EMU Dad's Room.

A reception in Collier House will follow each talk.

Klutznick is on campus for

two weeks as recipient of the Wayne Morse Chair of Law and Politics. He will speak to law, economics, political science, and business classes and meet faculty and students.

Besides being commerce secretary in the last year of the Carter administration, Klutznick was a member of several delegations to the United Nations. He founded and headed the Urban Investment and Development Co. in Chicago.
