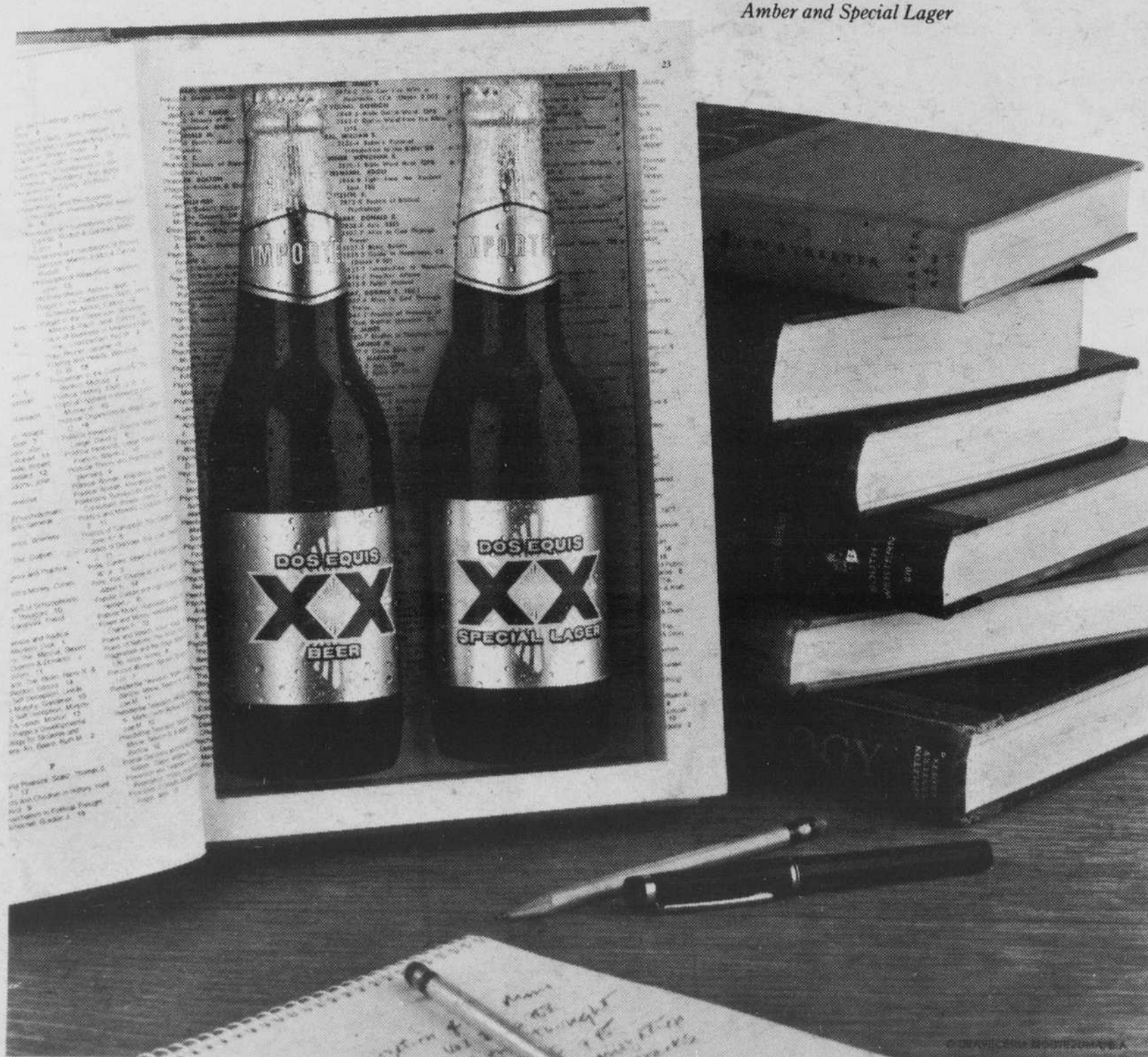


Photo festival offers classes

Upper Valley Arts of Leavenworth, WA, a non-profit organization founded in 1977 to promote and encourage the arts, announces its Photography Festival '81 series of summer photographic workshops and seminars.

Included in the summer schedule is a wildflower photography workshop on June 5 and 6. The workshop will take place in the foothills of the Cascade Range where wildflowers abound. The workshop fee of \$105 includes meals and overnight accommodations at Coppernotch Lodge.

Other courses include a photo-journalism workshop which will explore all aspects of creating a photo story or essay — from the conceptual stage to layout. This workshop is scheduled for June 20 and 21, and will also be held at Coppernotch Lodge. The fee is \$105 and includes meals and lodging. Freelance photographer Doug Wilson will assist students in preparing a photo layout in either newspaper or magazine style.

Additional workshops include: "An Experience in Awe," photographing the infinitesimal through a microscope and the astronomical through a telescope; "Collecting Photographs for Love and Money," a one-day seminar devoted to the collection, preservation and enjoyment of 19th and 20th Century photographs; and "An Artist's View of Nature," a week-long workshop of alpine photography.
