PE doctorate is fifth nationally

The University physical education doctoral program and faculty have been ranked fifth in the nation, according to a new survey.

The survey was conducted by John Massengale, a member of the physical education faculty at Eastern Washington University. 590 members of the National Association for Physical Education in Higher Education responded to the survey. Results were released March 27.

The doctoral ranking indicates stature of senior

department faculty and caliber of research being conducted, physical education department head Michael Ellis says.

"Our senior faculty members are known for the important research they are doing in biomechanics, sports medicine, applied psychology, and learning and control of human movement," Ellis says.

The physical education department is the oldest professional school of physical education in the country, Ellis says.
