# Crew team rows into Pac-10

After a year of early morning workouts, the Oregon crew team is ready for the Pacific-10 Conference crew championships in Palo Alto, Calif. this weekend.

The Duck crew team, a club sport at Oregon, will be competing against teams that are university sponsored, says crew member Tim Meier.

"They usually have better equipment, and coaching. But we have more heart."

The University of Washington is expected to take the team title again, Meier says. "But we could get lucky."

The team will enter four classes — four-man heavy, four-man light, eight-man heavy and eight-man light. Each boat will also include a coxswain — the person that keeps the rowers on stroke along the 2,000-meter course.

A coxswain takes the crew up to about 40 strokes a min-



ute at the start of the race before settling in about 34 strokes a minute, Meier says. Just before the end the number of strokes goes up again.

The classes are determined by the weight of the rowers. Each rower must weigh less

than 160 pounds in the light class, with the average weight being no more than 155 pounds. The heavy class is open ended, Meier says.

"The division is there because the larger guys can pull a little harder," Meier said. Twelve rowers, and the

coxswain, will travel to the Pac-10s, Meier says. But because of the teams limited funding they won't take any shells to the meet. "When we go to races we borrow boats."

However, that doesn't hinder the team, Meier says. "The race is all in the legs."
