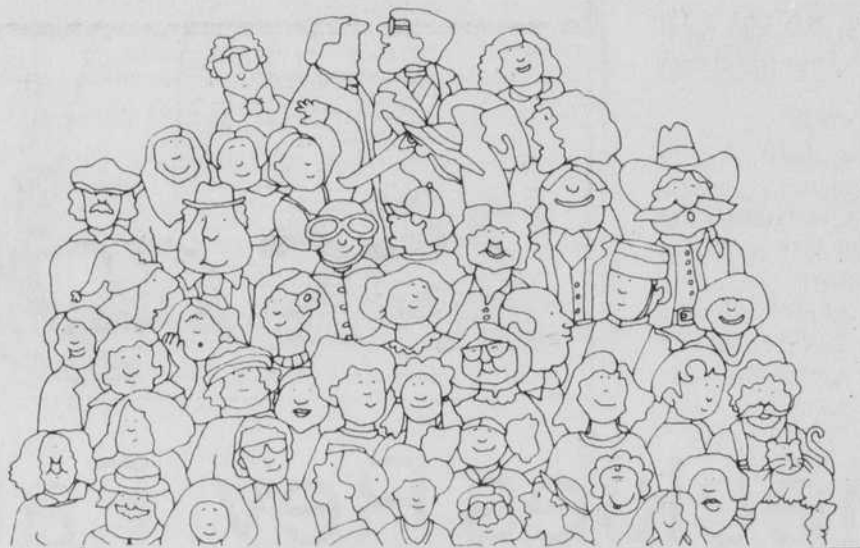

A fall term academic planning workshop especially for undeclared University students will be held today at 3:30 p.m. at the Office of Academic Advising and Student Services, Room 164 Oregon Hall.

The workshop will assist students in planning schedules aimed at satisfying graduation requirements, according to academic adviser Jack Bennett.

Bennett says small groups will discuss the merits of liberal arts courses versus job-related skills.

The workshop will include information about the University

grading system, academic majors, and an alternative to traditional academic counseling — peer advising.

Speakers will include pre-health sciences adviser Marliss Strange, campus paraprofessional program coordinator Debi Lance, and Bennett.
