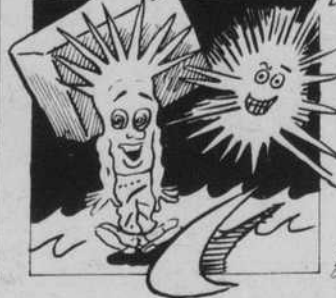

Assembly plans vote on semesters

The University Assembly will vote today on a proposed early semester system conversion at its 3:30 p.m. meeting in Room 150 Geology.

If approved, the switch would be effective in September, 1984,

and would feature two 16-week semesters and a calendar year beginning in late August and ending in early May.

Last week, the University Senate rejected the early semester motion 15-14 with two abstentions and instead

amended the rejected motion, 22-10 with two abstentions, to allow consideration of other semester switch options.

While Senate members generally approved of a switch, not everyone approved of the early system.

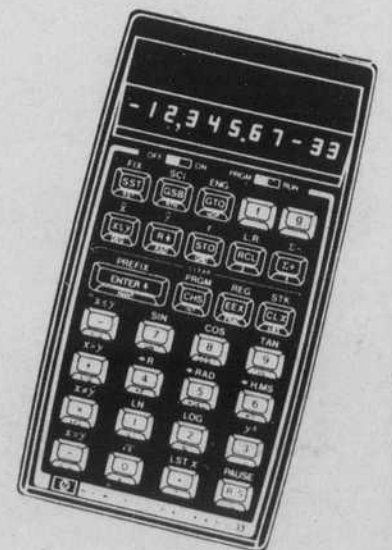
