Plays are Ashland's thing Shakespearean fest continues

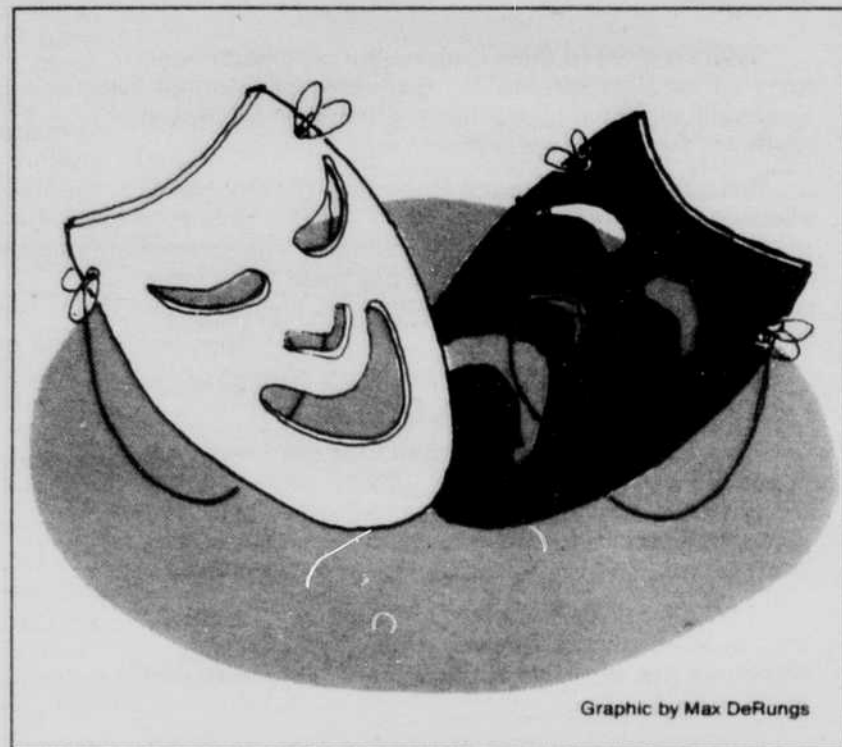
It's the only place in Oregon where kings and salesmen can be seen on the same stage, though not at the same time.

The Oregon Shakespearean Festival in Ashland continues its 1981 season this summer with four plays by the Bard and six by contemporary playwrights.

For Shakespeare buffs, the festival offers *Twelfth Night*, *Othello*, *Two Gentlemen of Verona* and *Henry IV, Part I*. With the exception of *Othello*, each Shakespearean play will unfold at the 1,194-seat Elizabethan Stagehouse, the largest of the festival's three theatres.

To complement the master, the festival has added Arthur Miller's *Death of a Salesman*, John O'Keefe's *Wild Oats*, Harold Pinter's *The Birthday Party*, Joanna Glass's *Artichoke*, John Ford's *'Tis Pity She's a Whore* and *The Island* by Athol Fugard.

Death of a Salesman almost speaks for itself, as Miller's study of the American Dream is considered his greatest work.

The Ashland production of *Wild Oats*, a boisterous quasi-Shakespearean comedy, has been widely praised. Both will be presented in the Angus Bowmer Theatre, named for the festival's founder. The theatre seats 600.

Artichoke, *The Birthday Party* and *The Island* will be presented at the 140-seat Black Swan Theatre, the festival's only indoor facility.

All 10 plays are being performed now with the exception of *The Island*, which opens July 11, and *Othello*, which opens August 2.

Tickets for the festival aren't cheap, but theatergoers get what they pay for. Performances at the Angus Bowmer and Elizabethan theatres are \$10.50, \$8.50 and \$5.50. All Black Swan theatre tickets are \$8.50. Those with

hearty legs can purchase standing-room-only ducats for \$3.50 for Elizabethan performances on the day of the show.

Tickets are available in Eugene at the EMU Main Desk; Carl Greve Jewelers, 51 W. Broadway; and Oregon Sampler, 123 Monroe St.

A special "Festival of Plays" package (for two or more people) offers two \$10.50 tickets per person for the Angus Bowmer or Elizabethan theatres, two nights' lodging at the hotel/motel of your choice, a backstage tour of the three theatres and one Ashland entertainment coupon book. The package costs \$56 a person.

Arrangements for the "Festival of Plays" can be made at any local travel agent or by calling Ashland Central Reservations at 488-1011.

Oregon Country Fair returns to Elmira site

Once again, the Oregon Country Fair will assemble at its traditional site in Elmira, 13 miles west of Eugene, July 10 through 12.

More than 300 booths selling handmade and hand-gathered goods and a variety of food will be set up along the fair's walkways. Two special displays — the Community Village and Oregon Energy Horizons — will provide information on energy-efficient ideas.

Entertainment will be offered

at several stage areas.

Free bus service from the Eugene downtown mall will begin at 10:30 a.m. and continue every half-hour on Friday and every 15 minutes on Saturday and Sunday. The last bus will leave the fair at 7 p.m.

Admission to the fair is \$4, with children under 12 admitted free. Senior citizens will receive a \$1 discount. A guidebook with fair information, a map and entertainment schedules is included in the admission price.

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
