

Science center exhibits holographs

For those interested in a fascinating tour through holographs, geometrical illusions and star shows, the Willamette Science and Technology Center will continue to operate this summer, Tuesdays through Sundays.

The center, located next to Autzen Stadium, houses participatory exhibits, a science store, and the Lane Education Service District Planetarium — listed as the "largest and most modern planetarium between San Francisco and Vancouver, B.C."

Displays at WISTEC include a human biology and nutrient exhibit that invites you to "analyze your lunch" via computer. Seismology, volcanology and plate tectonics line the walls, and an "energy resource quiz" tests your conservation knowledge. Laser light projects, floating images in space and 3-D glasses provide a surprising peek at a new perspective.

Program director Gaile Winterman says WISTEC offers "continually changing exhibits." A current exhibit features unique photos of Mt. St. Helens taken by National Geographic photographer Gary Rosenquist.

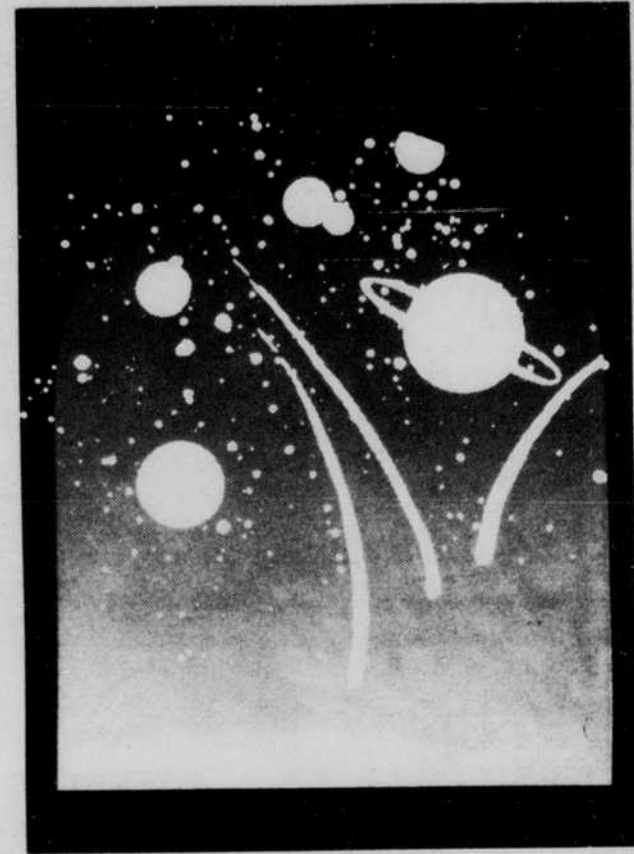
"The Space Shuttle — The First Spaceship" is a planetarium show scheduled to premier Tuesday, June 16. Another planetarium event this summer will feature a solar telescope that will magnify the sun onto a screen so its surface can be easily viewed.

WISTEC and the Planetarium represent the first components of a cooperative museum complex to be located in the Alton Baker Park Area. Funds allocated by the last legislative session, along with a bill currently before the Legislature, will determine when the future State Museum of Natural History will be situated at Alton Baker Park. At that time, the Lane County Museum also will relocate in the new complex.

WISTEC's summer classes begin June 23 and offer activities for ages four through adult. Preschool Science Discovery classes invite toddlers to incubate and collect aquatic animals. Older children and adults can choose from courses in computers, outdoor biology, wilderness survival, botanical illustration, physics and more. Costs range from \$8 to \$34 for members and non-members.

The center is a non-profit, private corporation that depends on memberships and community contributions for its operation. Openings always are available for volunteer exhibit guides, exhibit builders and artists. Those interested are asked to call Gaile Winterman or Carole Daly at 484-9027.

WISTEC summer hours will be Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday, noon to 5 p.m. Admission is \$2 for adults, \$1 for senior citizens and 75 cents for students and children six years and older.
