## Grad student receives \$5,000 fellowship

Jane Scheidecker, a first-year student in the University's master of business administration degree program, is the recipient of a \$5,000 fellowship from the American Association of University Women.

Scheidecker is one of 21 students who recently received awards from a variety of departments and schools at the

University.

The University's Law School announced 11 recipients of legal research and writing awards for the 1980-81 school year; the College of Education awarded Birse Memorial Excellence in Student Teaching awards to three students who completed their teacher training programs this spring; and the

Department of English honored seven students for their accomplishments.

The Department of English awards ranged from \$2,000 to \$25 and were awarded for "special accomplishments" in English.

Ruth Woolery of Springfield received the \$2,000 Eric Englund award while a senior English major at the University.

Other recipients of Department of English awards were Mary DeShazer, Russellville, Ky., \$500 Rudolph Ernst graduate fellowship; Marcy Willow, Eugene, \$50 Alicia Wood Poetry Award for use of traditional verse forms in her poetry; Ariel Friesner, Portland, \$50 Walter and Nancy Kidd Short Story Award; Michael Powell, La Jolla, Calif., Sarah Harkness Kirby Award for best seminar paper written during winter term; Jodi Cohen, Amherst, N.Y., \$25 Julia Burgess poetry award and \$50 Walter and Nancy Kidd Poetry award; Ann Dobyns, Brentwood Bay, British Columbia, Canada, recognized for excellence in

teaching a composition class.

The 11 recipients of the Law School awards are students in Legal Research and Writing, a required course for first-year law students.

First prizes were given to Robert Foster of Eugene for best brief and to William Knuthe of Shedd for best casenote.

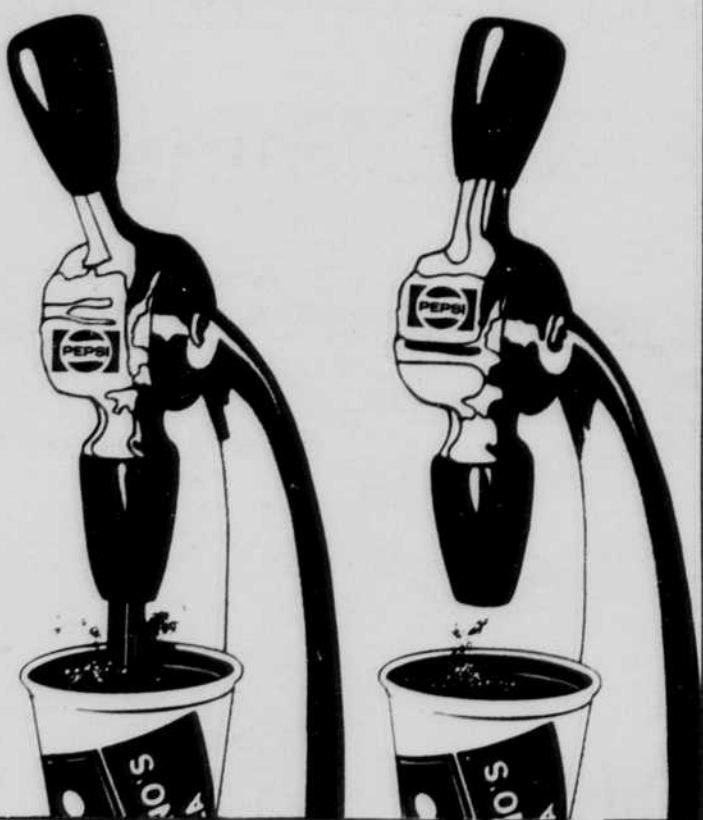
