## Pac-10 taps Salazar

Distance runner Alberto Salazar has been named the University's outstanding senior student-athlete by the Pacific-10 Conference.

Salazar, who graduated with a bachelors degree in business administration in June, was awarded the Pac-10's Conference Medal, which is awarded annually to one athlete from each conference school who best exhibits the greatest combination of performance and achievement in scholarship, athletics and leadership.

The Pac-10 winner in both the 5,000 and 10,000 meters at this year's conference track and field meet, Salazar also notched a win in the prestigious New York marathon last fall in only his first attempt at the distance.

Other 1981 Medal winners are football players Darrin Nelson of Stanford, Scott Pelluer of Washington State, and Mike Reilly of Washington; basketball standout Ray Blume of Oregon State; swimmer Par Arvidsson of California; tennis player Ted Staren of Arizona; water polo player Craig Furniss of Southern California; wrestler Dan Severn of Arizona State; and soccer player Charles Fisher of UCLA.
