## Writing program initiated

Six public and private colleges and universities in Oregon and Washington are beginning a writing program that emphasizes the close relationship between precise writing and precise thinking.

The three-year project is funded by a \$379,869 grant from the National Endowment for the

Humanities, according to Alan Kimball, director of the Robert D. Clark Honors College at the University.

The University honors college and the five other institutions form the Pacific Northwest Writing Consortium. The consortium's office is located at the honors college, which will administer the grant.

The PNWC is composed of Lewis and Clark College, Portland; University of Washington, Seattle; Pacific Lutheran University and the University of Puget Sound, both in Tacoma; The Evergreen State College, Olympia; and the University.

The schools established the consortium in 1979 when they discovered all six were beginning to ask faculty teaching liberal arts courses such as political science and biology to teach writing in those courses as well.

The grant will help the schools expand their efforts to integrate writing instruction into existing liberal arts courses in both the humanities and the sciences, according to Kimball.

To prepare faculty members for this new role in teaching writing, the schools will hold faculty and curriculum development workshops and exchange curriculum materials. Consultations between the schools, a newsletter and an annual regional conference are also planned.

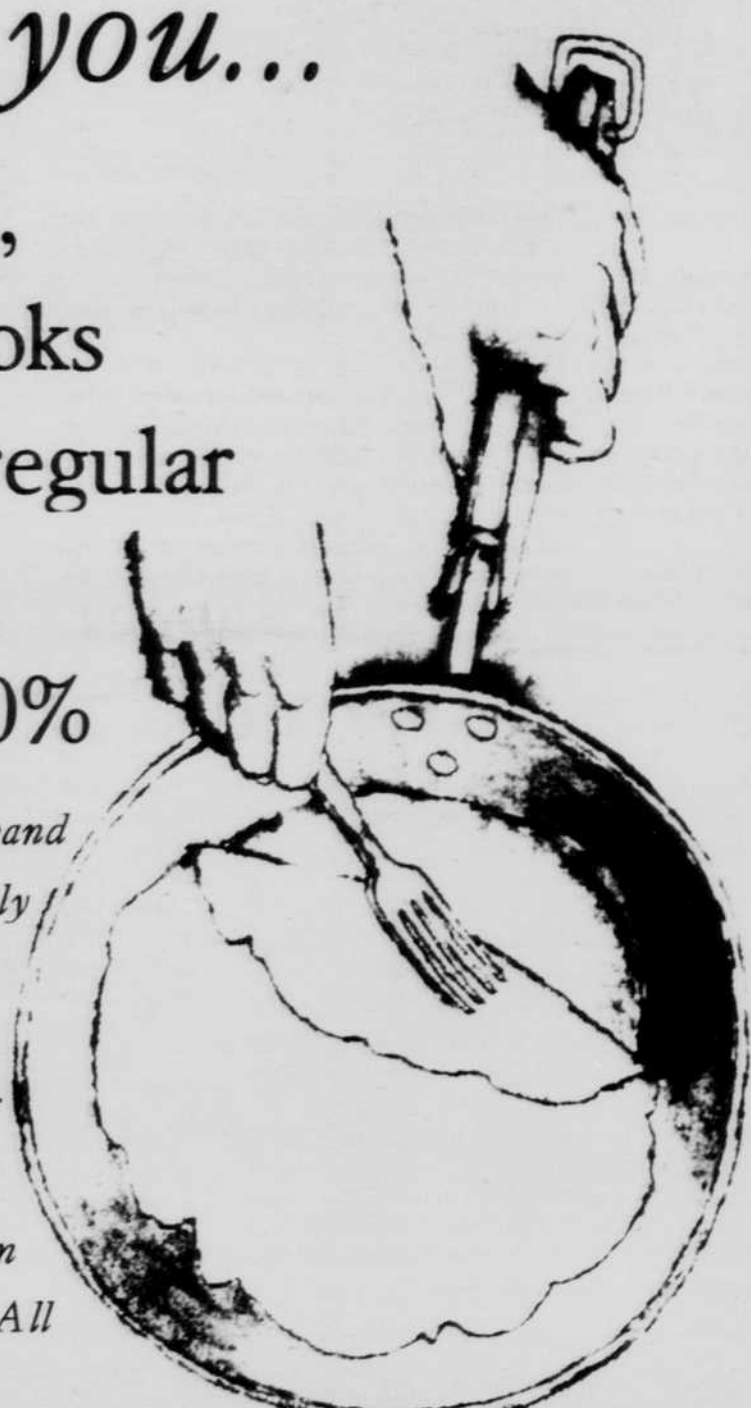
