The University's quarterly magazine for alumni and its radio news service have received Exceptional Achievement Awards in the 1981 Council for Advancement and Support of Education national competition.

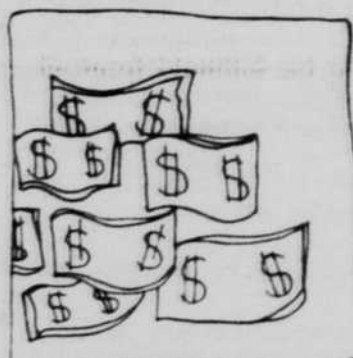

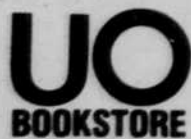
