Taped telephone service puts answers at fingertips

Obtaining information ranging from the registration schedule to alcohol abuse is as easy as a phone call, thanks to the TEL-INFO program.

TEL-INFO, a taped telephone service available to students and community members, informs callers about the University and many of its programs.

By dialing 686-4636 or 686-INFO, callers can request tapes on more than 150 topics, including admissions, recreation and entertainment, housing, student organizations and educational resources and programs.

Career Planning and Placement — which provides job listing information — and the Calendar of Events are two of the most popular tapes.

A service provided by the Dean of Students Office, TEL-INFO was started in March of 1979 under the direction of Hilda Young, coordinator of special projects.

The program began with 75 different tapes, but after 2½ years the number of tapes has doubled — and the service continues to grow. New tape topics will include the map room, the math library and the psychology clinic.

Serving an average of 50 callers a day, TEL-INFO has provided information to more than 35,000 callers, some from as far away as Florida and Alaska.

Listings of the TEL-INFO tapes can be found in the time schedule of classes, the faculty and staff directory and the student directory.

Brochures listing the names and numbers of the tapes are available at Oregon Hall and the EMU Student Information Booth. A recorded index also is available by calling the service and requesting tape 100.

The TEL-INFO phones, which are manned by EMU Main Desk employees, are in service from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. Monday through Saturday and from 1 p.m. to 11 p.m. Sundays.

Whittle away those extra hours at an EMU Craft Center class

From silkscreening to soldering, bike repair to quilting, the Craft Center offers students a way to putter away academic overdoes.

"The Craft Center serves as a divergence from academics," says a staff member.

Located downstairs in the EMU, the center offers workshops and work space to interested students and community members. Workshops include woodworking, fibers, art prep, stained glass, photography, ceramics, bike repair, graphics, design and watercolor, says acting director Diana Hoffman.

Craft Center membership, required for workshops that use the center's facilities and equipment, also provides access to a wide range of facilities, including a woodshop, dark-rooms equipped for both color and black and white printing, a ceramic studio with high fire capabilities, a metal working area equipped for jewelry casting and soldering, and facilities for silkscreen, batik, stained glass, lapidary and sewing.

Membership costs \$6 for those affiliated with the University and \$12 for community members. Daily use is \$1.

Registration for fall-term workshops, which takes place in the downstairs forum of the EMU (across from the Craft Center), begins Sept. 30 for University students, faculty, and classified staff and Oct. 2 for community members.

Fall-term hours for the center are 9:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday and 12:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Sunday.
