# Food service evolves

An improved pricing technique, a microwave oven, fresh doughnuts and a new combination item are among the improvements EMU director Adell McMillan and food service director Jim Covington say they plan for campus cafeterias this fall.

The Skylight Refectory, which in the past has featured only

sweet rolls, will be adding fresh doughnuts to its morning fare.

Located in the upper level of the EMU, the small cafeteria will continue to serve the popular Greek Gyros (pronounced year-ohs) sandwich, made of pita bread, freshly roasted lamb, green peppers, onions and choice of sour cream or hot sauce. The Gyros is one of few deviations from the Skylight's normal vegetarian menu.

The Deli, located in the Fish-

bowl, added a microwave oven this summer that lets customers heat deli sandwiches that previously were served cold.

The Deli also is adding a new item consisting of a cup of soup and a half sandwich, thought to be more realistic than a soup and sandwich being sold as separate items, McMillan says.

If the electronic equipment is delivered by fall, McMillan says the EMU salad bar in the main cafeteria will be changing to a more precise pricing system.

Rather than the size of the bowl determining the salad's price, the new system will be based on the weight of the salad, with per-ounce pricing.

McMillan says this is a more economical way of pricing that also allows the food service to have a wider variety of food items available. In the past, if the price of a food item — such as tomatoes — became too high, it


When you move out, call EWEB to stop service. Remember, you are responsible for paying all EWEB charges from when you begin occupancy until you tell EWEB to stop service.
