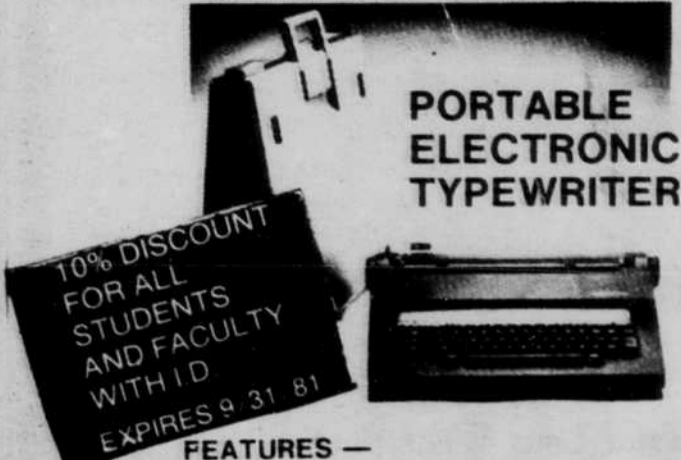

"We can offer substitutions, different kinds of proteins to red meat — that sort of thing. We would like to educate people on campus to these alternatives."

A three credit class entitled Food, Hunger and You is being offered Fall Term through the University's Search program. The 200-level class will deal with the political aspects of food, and many other topics relevant to food and hunger.

The class is scheduled for Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 3:30 to 5:00.

Part of the process to educate the campus is an outreach program that includes publishing a newsletter, which usually comes out once each term.

The newsletter covers many aspects of food, including the politics of food. The food-op also sponsored a conference last year, which Coulter says he hopes to do again this year. He says "the basic thrust (of the conference) will be to provide for students, to educate them."

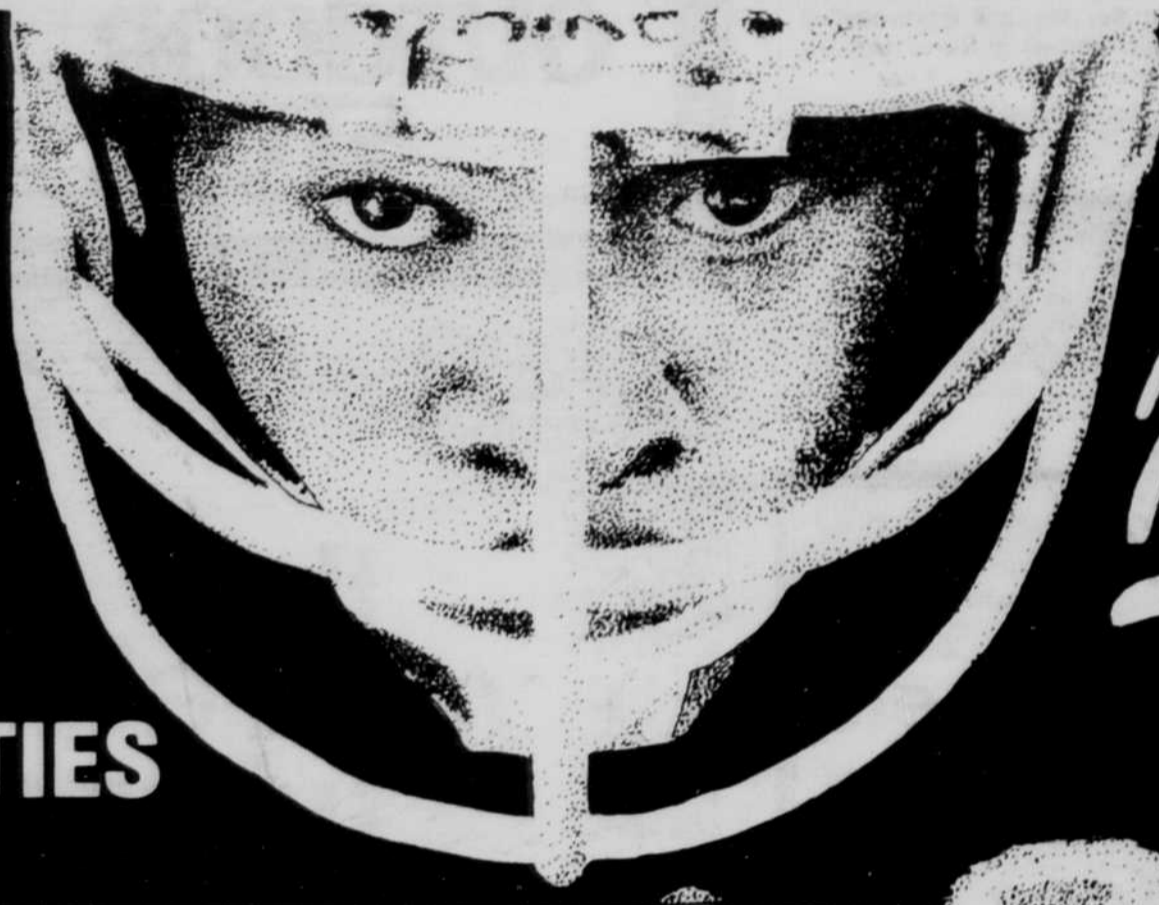
