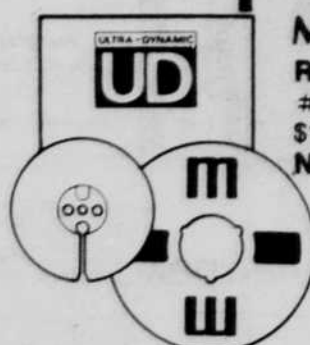

Gov. Atiyeh unveils drunken driver plan

Gov. Victor Atiyeh unveiled a plan to combat drunken drivers at last week's 14th annual Oregon Traffic Safety Conference.

The program, called REDDI — Report Every Drunken Driver Immediately — is already in effect. Television, radio, news papers and billboards soon will be inundated with the plan, which Atiyeh says he hopes will carry the same impact as former Gov. Tom McCall's bottle bill.

"It will work if we make it work," he says.

REDDI provides a toll free telephone number for the Oregon State Police that enables people who spot drunk drivers to notify the police by calling and giving a description of the car and the direction it was headed.

In spite of Atiyeh's enthusiasm for the campaign, it received some criticism from participants at the safety conference.

"By the time we notify the police, the offender is going to be home, or too far down the road to be found," said one member of the audience.

Atiyeh countered the criticism by describing an incident last

year during the holiday season when a driver zipped past him on the right side of the road — on the shoulder. He said he notified the police as quickly as he could and the driver was apprehended about 20 miles down the road.

The driver had a blood alcohol content of .19 percent, Atiyeh said. A .10 percent alcohol content is considered legally drunk according to Oregon law.

A high point of Atiyeh's REDDI program is the television spots that he unveiled for the first time at the Traffic Safety Conference.

The short, direct commercials feature Sheri Seitzinger, a former Miss Portland who now is a paraplegic as the result of an auto accident with a drunken driver.

Atiyeh emphasized that traffic crashes are the number one cause of death in Oregon for people under 45. Fifty percent of all traffic fatalities are caused by drunken drivers, he said, and one out of four Oregonians will be injured by a drunken driver.
