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## IFC elects Rasmussen

The Incidental Fee Committee meeting elected Karsten Rasmussen, a third-year law student, as committee chairman, and undergraduate psychology major Xavier Romano as vice-chairman.

Evaluating the 1981-82 committee, Rasmussen says there won't be much "block voting," and committee members will concentrate more on issues than in the past.

Although members will lobby with each other all year, there won't be any "blatant vote trading," Rasmussen says. He claims that some vote trading did occur last year.

Rasmussen says he plans to streamline goals hearings—where the goals of each organization applying for funding are examined—keep incidental fees at this year's reduced level and look into reducing athletic fees.

In other business, the committee unanimously voted to allow the Panhellenic Council to carry-over from last year \$513 in fund-raising money earmarked for recruiting activities. Without the carry-over, the funds would have been placed in a surplus fund.

In addition, the IFC allowed the Gay People's Alliance to return \$1,000 of its 1981-82 funds to the surplus account to make up part of a \$1,900 deficit

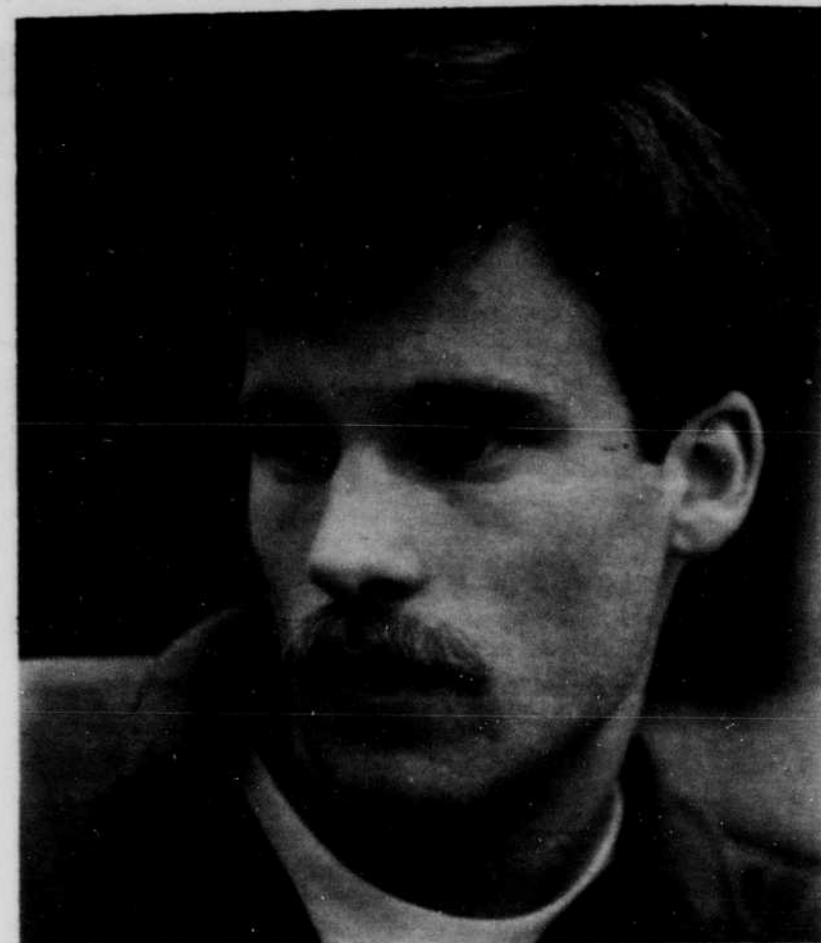

incurred last year.

The group probably will receive limited funding during the 1982-83 year, Rasmussen says, because the deficit resulted from mismanagement of funds by last year's staff.

Other committee members include law students Steve Baldwin and Cathi Bulone, political science major David Gibson and music major Pamela

Jordon.

Committee meetings will be held every Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. until further notice. This Tuesday's meeting will be in EMU Room 337.

Agenda items include a request for funding by the Teacher Education Graduate Student Organization, which apparently was left out of last year's budgeting process.

## NRC announces awards

The National Research Council has announced approximately 250 new full-time fellowships for 1982. The awards will enable Ph.D. scientists and engineers to research problems in their fields of study.

Awards are made for the year with possible extensions through a second year; senior applicants may request shorter tenures. Stipends range from \$24,000 a year for recent Ph.D.s to approximately \$50,000 a year for Senior Associates. Allowances are made for relocation and limited professional travel during tenure. The host federal laboratory provides the Fellow with facilities, necessary equipment and support services.

The awards will be awarded on a competitive basis for research in chemistry, engineering, mathematics and earth sciences, environmental, physical, space and life sciences. The fellowships, which began in 1954, have assisted more than 3,500 scientists who range from recent Ph.D. recipients to distinguished senior scientists.
