Oregon's men's soccer squad opened its league season Sunday with a 5-1 thumping of Lewis and Clark College at Autzen Stadium.

Senior forward Bob Keady put on a one-man show for the Ducks as he knocked in four of Oregon's five goals. Keady, a candidate for all-league honors, made two scores in each half. Rookie Slomoko Sowazi from South Africa was credited with Oregon's other score.

The Ducks travel to Washington next weekend for matches against Seattle University and Puget Sound.

Cubans to visit Ducks

The Cuban national women's basketball team will take on the University of Oregon women on Monday, Nov. 23, in an exhibition game at McArthur Court at 7:30 p.m.

The game will be the season-opener for the Ducks who last year were 25-7 and ranked 12th nationally. For the Cubans, it will be the last stop on a lengthy road trip in the U.S. Cuba won the 1979 Pan American Games title, upsetting the U.S. women in the championship game.

Tickets for the game will go on sale in October at the McArthur Court ticket office. Reserved seats are \$5, general admission seats are \$3 for adults and \$2 for students.

Lamp close to signing

PORTLAND (AP) — A Portland television station said Monday it had information that the Portland Trail Blazers had reached general agreement on a contract with forward Jeff Lamp, the National Basketball Association team's No. 1 1981 draft choice.

KOIN-TV did not specify the source of its information.

It said no contract had yet been signed by the 6-foot-6 forward from Virginia.

The Blazers' director of player personnel, Stu Inman, declined to confirm or deny the report. He said, however, that he hoped Lamp would be in Portland by Wednesday.

George Kalifatis, Lamp's lawyer, could not be reached. He said last week that the Blazers' signing of Darnell Valentine "puts pressure on us to come to terms."

Trojans remain atop poll

Thanks to their last-gasp 28-24 triumph over runner-up Oklahoma, the Trojans of Southern California have become the first team this season to hold onto the No. 1 ranking in The Associated Press college football poll for more than one week.

However, Notre Dame and Nebraska, two of the nation's traditional powers, fell out of the rankings after suffering their second setbacks in three games. Notre Dame was beaten 15-14 in the last-minute by Purdue while Nebraska lost to Penn State 30-24.

Southern Cal, which scored with two seconds remaining to nip Oklahoma, received 57 1/2 of 66 first-place votes and 1,311 of a possible 1,320 points Monday from a nationwide panel of sports writers and sportscasters.

Penn State, third a week ago, climbed into second place after downing Nebraska. The Nittany Lions received 5 1/2 first-place votes and 1,208 points.

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but it would take a lot to get me that way. I'm just one of those guys who will sit back and wait to take his turn."

It seemed like Oregon's turn for a chance at a bowl game had popped up this year, or at least until the Ducks dropped three of their first four games. Much of the criticism was directed at the offensive line, criticism which Delegato says is partially deserved.

"I think it's a lot of inexperience," says Delegato. "We lost three possible starters — Scott Shephard, Garrett Earle and Jeff Kubitz — that we couldn't afford to lose. We've got a lot of talent on the offensive line but it's young and inexperienced."

Delegato's presence thus becomes doubly important.

"The thing I have to do is give

them as much confidence as I can."

And while his fellow offensive linemen will notice his leadership abilities and blocking, few if any fans will realize his important contributions to Oregon's offensive attack.

That doesn't rub Delegato the wrong way, however.

"You can't be out for the glory," he says. "Just feeling good about the way I play is enough for me."

And it's more than enough for the Ducks.

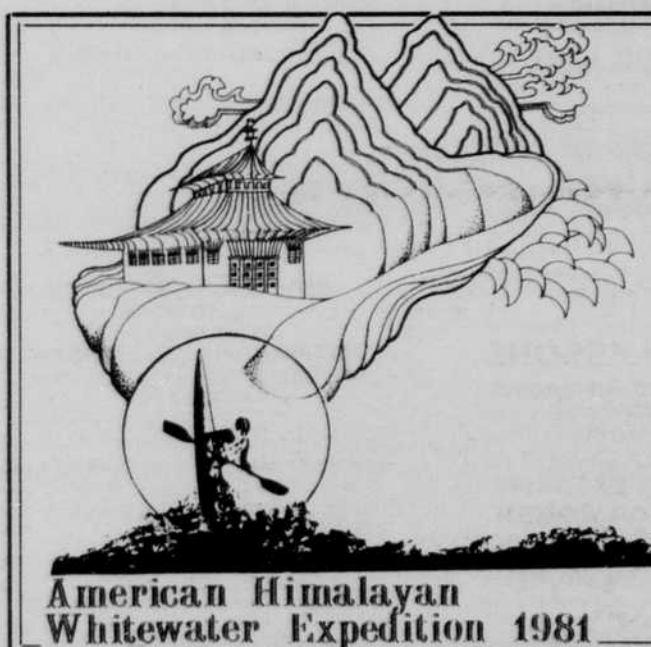
Davis Cup squad member hospitalized

The four-man squad meets the U.S. team in a best-of-five-matches semifinal series beginning Friday.



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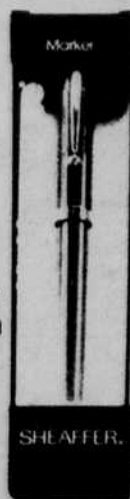
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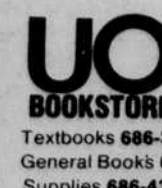


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
