Doctoral, masters programs honored

Both the doctoral program and the master's degree program of the University's health education department have been ranked among the top programs nationally, according to a recent study conducted at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana.

The doctoral program was ranked fourth and the master's program second. The nationwide survey included the responses of 245 health education department heads and faculty members from among the 40 doctoral programs and 126 master's degree programs in health education in the United States.

Oregon currently offers the only health education doctorate in Oregon, according to Richard Schlaadt, depart-

ment head.

The top five doctoral programs, in order, are at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana; Southern Illinois University; Ohio State University; Oregon; and the University of Toledo. The top five master's degree programs, in order, are at Ball State University; Oregon; Indiana State University; Ohio State University; and Southern Illinois University.

The doctoral program in physical education was recently ranked fifth in the nation among the 98 colleges and universities offering doctoral degrees in physical education. And the recreation and park management program was ranked ninth nationally among the approximately 500 schools awarding degrees in recreation and park management.

Students receive awards

Two students in the Department of Germanic Languages and Literature and one student in the Comparative Literature Program at the University have received teaching appointments in West Germany.

The three students, all former graduate teaching fellows in German at the University, received the appointments from the German Pedagogical Exchange Service and will teach English for one year during 1981-82 in German secondary schools.

degree candidate in Germanic languages and literature, was awarded a teaching appointment in a school in Rheinland-Pfalz.

Dan Hamann, a master's degree candidate in Germanic languages and literatures, has been awarded a teaching appointment in Ansbach, Bavaria.

Ruth Mills-Price, a doctoral degree candidate in comparative literature, has received a teaching appointment in a school in Leverkusen-Rheindorf.
