Five honored for contributions

Five distinguished Oregonians will be honored Oct. 16 as recipients of Oregon Pioneer awards from the University for their contributions in the fields of philanthropy, politics, industry and the arts.

The recipients are Maurie Jacobs, Lynn McCready and the late Don Barker, all of Eugene; Eleanor Collier Ehlers of Klamath Falls; and Jane Hoyman Carpenter of Medford.

A dinner to honor this year's recipients will be held Oct. 16 at Gerlinger Alumni Lounge. The five will also be recognized at halftime of the Homecoming football game at Autzen Stadium on Oct. 17.

The award's description reads in part: "The University of Oregon Pioneer Award recog-

nizes those individuals who have been willing to lead rather than follow, to take risks rather than see opportunities pass by."

Barker was a leader in the Oregon timber industry, serving on the State Board of Forestry for 12 years, longer than any other appointee. He was well known in Eugene for his gifts of money and time to many groups, especially those involving athletics and young people.

The owner of M. Jacobs Fine Furniture in Eugene and Drexel Heritage Interiors in Springfield, Jacobs was named Oregon's Retailer of the Year for 1979 and Eugene's First Citizen that same year. He directed the campaign to win approval of the \$18.5 million bond issue for Eugene's

civic center project.

McCready has been a financial and civic leader in Eugene for more than 50 years. McCready has been a director of the University Foundation and currently serves on the foundation's investment committee.

Ehlers is a well-known leader in the arts and philanthropy in Klamath County. A trustee for the PEO Program for Continuing Education, she has helped raise more than \$1 million for scholarships and grants.

Carpenter has made important contributions to the quality of education in Oregon. She is president of the Carpenter Foundation which uses half of its resources to support college scholarships for Medford-area students.

University parcels out \$178,400 in scholarships

More than \$175,000 in University general scholarships have been awarded for the 1981-82 school year to some 250 students.

According to Carol Richard, assistant director of student financial aid, \$178,400 in scholarship monies were distributed to qualified students at all levels of study based on an academic rating system as well as on their financial need.

Over 80 percent of the

scholarships, worth \$147,250, were distributed on both academic merit and financial need. Individual awards ranged from \$400 to \$1,200.

Richard noted that these scholarships have been established with donations rather than with state and federal tax dollars. Many are supported by interest income earned on the investment of gifts and contributions from private donors.

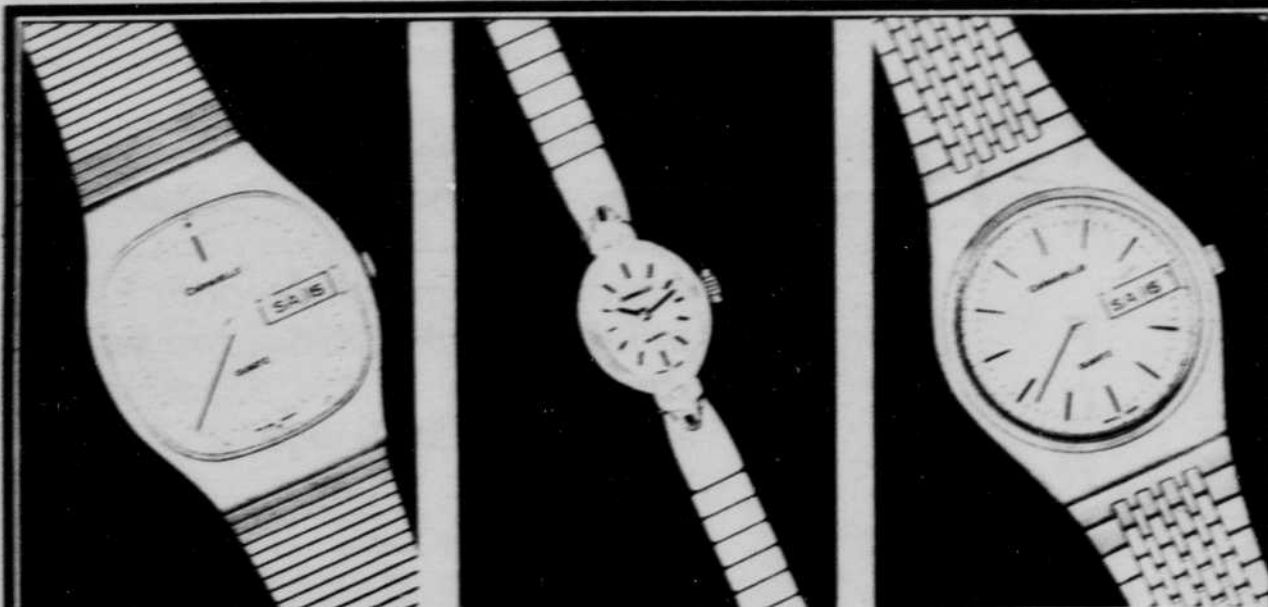
