'Yellow ribbon' trial begins today

Two Revolutionary Communist Youth Brigade members go to trial today for their role in a ribbon-burning incident Feb. 9 during the University reception for former hostage Victor Tomseth.

John Kaiser and Nancy Whitley face first-degree arson charges and up to 20 years in prison and a fine of \$10,000 if convicted.

According to witnesses, Kaiser rushed to the stage where Tomseth was speaking and threw a burning swath of yellow cloth on the stage.

The cloth allegedly was lit by Whitley. Whitley faces an additional charge of fourth-degree assault for allegedly attacking a Eugene Police Officer as he took Kaiser into custody.

Judge George Woodrich is presiding over the jury trial being held at Lane County Circuit Court.

Dance to replenish switchboard funds

The Eugene Switchboard, an information and referral agency near the downtown mall, is sponsoring a "Celebration of the 50s" dance Friday night at the WOW Hall, at 8th Avenue and Lincoln Street.

The 9 p.m. dance will be a fund-raising event for the agency, whose new executive director, Steve Bekofsky, says his organization is facing financial difficulties and will use "creative" means to raise funds.

Bekofsky, who started in his position Thursday, is a former free-lance cross-cultural consultant to Native Americans in Canada.

"I wanted to get involved in my own community," says Bekofsky explaining why he took the job.

Featured at Friday's dance will be the acapella White Tones, local disc jockey Johnny Etheridge, and Rockin' Deva Rahi. Available at the dance will be beer, wine, and baked goods. The doors open at 8 p.m. Dance patrons will be

charged \$3 to \$4 based on a "sliding scale." All dancers 35 or older or in 50s dress will be charged a dollar less.

Switchboard, known as "Lane County's only generic information and referral agency," receives funding from county revenue sharing, United Way, private foundations, ASUO, various grants, fundraisers, and fees.

Serving University students and the rest of the community since 1969, the agency receives phone calls and visitors requesting information on scores of different subjects

The ASUO program guide refers to the agency as a "clearinghouse of information," having files containing more than "200,000 pieces of information" on government agencies, lost and found pets, entertainment, employment and educational opportunities, temporary shelter, transportation, and housing, according to Keenan.

"We never know what's going to be on the other end of the phone," Keenan says.
