## Prof lands farm architecture grant

Thomas Hubka, a University architecture professor, has received an \$18,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities to expand his study of Northern New England farm architecture.

Hubka recently returned to

Eugene from a one-year sabbatical leave in Maine where he documented some of the state's historic houses and barns in Kennebunk and North Yarmouth. While there, he lived in a traditional "connected farmhouse," with house, out-

buildings and barns attached in a row.

The grant will allow Hubka to broaden the scope of his earlier research which concentrated specifically on the architectural aspects of early farm buildings, especially the connected ones.
