Two University students are among the 50 active duty soldiers in the nation selected this year for Army ROTC Active Duty Scholarships.

Matthew Owen of Beaverton and Debra Hall of San Antonio, Texas, were chosen from among more than 3,000 applicants on the basis of their academic achievement, activities, leadership potential and demonstrated motivation

toward an Army career. Each three-year scholarship provides tuition, books, lab fees and a \$100-per-month living allowance.
