WSU dumps Oregon

39-7 performance shows Ducks how it's done

In the last six games, the Oregon football team's offense has managed a total of three touchdowns. The Ducks had to rely on a kickoff return Saturday for their only score, losing to Washington State 39-7.

It happened against Arizona State, UCLA and now Washington State — the Ducks' defense has kept Oregon (1-8) alive for a good portion of each of those games. But a combination of too much time on the playing field and the quality of the opposing offenses have eventually worn them down.

The Cougars not only wore down the Oregon defense, they had the Ducks on the run by the end of the game. The Cougars turned a close, 12-7 halftime score into a rout with 27 points in the second half.

Washington State (7-1-1) did it with 306 yards rushing and a 256-yard aerial show by quarterbacks Clete Casper, Ricky Turner and Mark Rypien. Senior flankers Paul Escalera and Jeff Keller were at the receiving end of most of the passes. Escalera caught eight passes for 107 yards and Keller contributed four catches for 63 yards.

The other portion of the 562-yard offensive effort by WSU, was the rushing attack led by running backs Robert Williams and Tim Harris.

Williams carried 11 times for 83 yards and two touchdowns, and Harris carried 12 times for 72 yards and one touchdown.

Reggie Brown led the Ducks in rushing and in total yards on offense, gaining almost half of Oregon's total for the afternoon. Brown rushed for 65 yards on 17 carries. Oregon had 139 yards of total offense.

Brown's two fumbles in Oregon territory, led to the first two scores for WSU. The Cougars recovered the first fumble at the Oregon 12 yard line and later scored on a 1-yard quarterback keeper by Turner. The kick failed, and WSU took a 6-0 lead with 4:14 remaining in the first quarter.

The Ducks took the lead when Steve Brown returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for Oregon's lone touchdown. Doug Jollymour added the extra point, and the Ducks celebrated a short-lived 7-6 lead with 4:10 remaining in the first quarter.

Washington State captured the lead for the remainder of the game after recovering another fumble at the Oregon 37. It took just two plays — a 22-yard burst by James Matthews and a touchdown jaunt of 15 yards by Harris — for the Cougars to score again. Washington State had to settle for a 12-7 lead at halftime as the two-point conversion failed.

The telling play for the remainder of the game may have been when Oregon coach Rich Brooks

Trailblazers beat Denver, still undefeated

PORTLAND (AP) — Calvin Natt and Billy Ray Bates combined for 26 Portland points in the fourth quarter as the Trailblazers came from behind to defeat the Denver Nuggets 120-116 and remain the only unbeaten team in the National Basketball Association.

After trailing through most of the second and third quarters, the Blazers finally took the lead at 99-97 on a jump shot by Bates, who had 13 of his 16 points in the last quarter.

Natt scored 13 of his team-leading 30 points in the final quarter.

No one scored a point for Portland while Bates and Natt were on their tear.

Alex English kept the Nuggets close with 12 of his game-high 32 points in the final period.

Portland, 6-0 in the Pacific Division, plays Dallas in Portland on Tuesday. The Nuggets will play Phoenix in Denver on the same night.



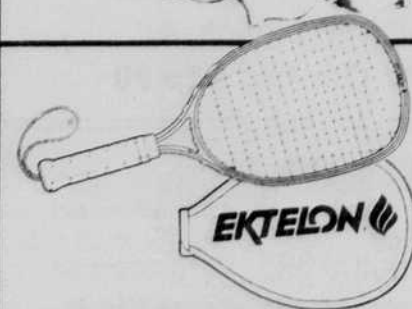
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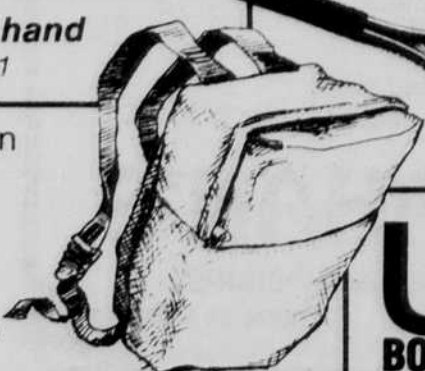
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
